#### **Predictive Services Discussion:**

A cold front will move into the southern Plains, Ohio Valley, and Northeast today. Breezy and dry southwest winds will continue ahead of the front in New England, before widespread showers and isolated thunderstorms move in overnight. Widespread showers and scattered thunderstorms will also develop in the Ohio Valley today, where the heaviest rainfall is expected. However, only isolated showers are expected in the southern Plains and into the Southeast. Widespread showers and isolated thunderstorms will also develop in New Mexico today on the tail end of the front. Much of the West will be drier with near normal temperatures, but light winds. Dry air will also spread into much of the northern Plains. A strong storm will affect western Alaska today with widespread precipitation and breezy south winds.
