**Labor Mountain**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). Ten miles north of Cle Elum, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Lower Sugarloaf**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Twelve miles northeast of Leavenworth, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Moon Complex**, Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). Eleven miles northeast of Agness, OR. Closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Wildcat**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty miles west of Naches, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Breezy and dry northerly winds will develop across the Northeast today, with the strongest winds in Maine where gusts to 35 mph are expected amid relative humidity as low as 30%, but recent rainfall will mitigate. Breezy southerly winds gusting to 35 mph are expected in Iowa and Minnesota creating locally elevated conditions. Isolated showers will develop in portions of the Southeast, with more widespread thunderstorms along the Florida east coast. Dry and warm conditions will persist across the northern two-thirds of the Intermountain West, while scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms will develop in Arizona and the southern Great Basin due to moisture from decaying Tropical Storm Priscilla. An upper-level low off the Northwest coast will bring scattered showers to the Cascades and coast today, but dry conditions will persist farther east.
