Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR and two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel have been deployed to Channel Islands, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally. Their respective units are as follows: 302nd (Peterson SFB, CO) and 152nd AW (Reno, NV) to Klamath Falls, OR and 146th AW (Channel Islands, CA) and 153rd AW (Cheyenne, WY) to Channel Islands, CA.

Six US Army HH-60 MEDEVAC Helicopters from the 1st Air Cavalry Brigade (Fort Hood, TX) have been deployed to California to support wildland fire operations nationally.

* **Root**, Shasta Trinity NF, USFS. Six miles southwest of Dunsmuir, CA. Timber. Extreme fire behavior with long-range spotting, uphill runs and wind-driven runs. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Dillon, Six Rivers NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 1). CIMT is also managing the Blue incident. Sixteen miles North of Orleans, CA. Timber. Active fire behavior with running, group torching and long-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Blue, Klamath NF, USFS. Ten miles east of Happy Camp, CA. Chaparral and timber. Active fire behavior with running, group torching and long-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Swift Complex, Shasta Trinity NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). Nine miles southwest of Trinity Center, CA. Includes the previously reported Peak fire. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Log, Klamath NF, USFS. Eighteen miles west of Etna, CA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior.

R-14 Buffalo, Northern California District, BLM. Eighteen miles west of Gerlach, NV. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching and creeping. Structures and sage-grouse habitat threatened.

Pickett, Sonoma-Lake Napa Unit, Cal Fire. CIMT (Cal Fire Team 4). One mile northeast of Calistoga, CA. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Trail closures in effect.

Crown Creek, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 12). CIMT is also managing the Blackhawk Mountain and Katy Creek incidents. Eighteen miles northeast of Kettle Falls, WA. Closed timber litter and timber. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, group torching and spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Blackhawk Mountain, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Twenty-one miles northeast of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Katy Creek, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Six miles northwest of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, backing and flanking. Structures threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Wildcat, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10) mobilizing. Thirty miles west of Naches, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Emigrant, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). Twenty-two miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Medium slash, timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with torching, flanking and uphill runs. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Flat, Sisters Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 3). Seven miles west of Culver, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened.

Bear Gulch, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Hoodspport, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Pomas, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty-six miles northwest of Entiat, WA. Grass, timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Juniper Canyon, Pendleton Unit, Oregon DOF. Started on private land 12 miles northeast of Hermiston, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Perry, North Cascades NP, NPS. Sixteen miles northeast of Newhalem, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with backing, uphill runs and short crown runs. Structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

* **Rattlesnake**, Colville Agency, BIA. Two miles west of Seven Bays, WA. Grass, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running and spotting. Residences threatened.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms with gusty outflow winds are expected along the Sierra Front into Northern California and southern Oregon, where increasing IA could result in new large fires. Near record temperatures with RH values in the low teens across the Northwest and Northern Rockies will create an overall fire environment which is conducive to large fire growth as the ridge of high pressure expands up into British Columbia. Southern California may see a better chance of showers with scattered thunderstorms. Elsewhere across the Interior West, gradual warming and drying continues under the ridge with generally light winds.

In the Eastern US, a cold front moving into the Upper Mississippi Valley will bring light showers and cooler temperatures to the area. Light showers will also develop over Tennessee and Kentucky as well as southern Texas and Florida, while the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast remain dry.
