Predictive Services Discussion:

Above normal temperatures will persist from the Pacific Northwest across the northern Great Basin into Northern Rockies with humidity as low as 15%, but temperatures will continue to be impacted by the smoke produced by the fires, including those in southern British Columbia. Visibility is likely to continue to be poor for the Northwest, Idaho, and west of the Divide in Montana and Wyoming. Isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms will develop from the Northwest into southern and central Idaho, with ignitions possible but not to the extent seen in previous days. Isolated to scattered drier storms are likely to continue overnight in parts of western and eastern Washington, and outflows from these storms have the potential to affect the ongoing fires. Drier air remains in place across Montana and Wyoming near and east of the Divide with humidity as low as 12–15% with easterly wind gusts 10–20 mph. To the south, near normal temperatures and seasonably low humidity are expected in California as onshore flow increases. However, locally breezy southwest winds 15–20 mph with gusts to 35 mph amid humidity as low as 10–15% will develop along the Sierra Front into southeast Oregon creating locally elevated conditions. Scattered wet thunderstorms are expected in the eastern Great Basin to the West Slope and Southwest, with the heaviest rain in portions of the Southwest.

In the Eastern US, the cold front will stretch from Texas into the Northeast as it continues to progress south and eastward. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop along and ahead of the front from Texas into the Southeast, with more widespread showers and thunderstorms in the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic, although the coast may see less rainfall. Isolated showers closer to the low pressure are also expected from the Upper Midwest into the Great Lakes, along with cooler temperatures and higher humidity. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will persist in Florida while dry conditions persist along the Southeast coast.
