Lower Sugarloaf, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Labor Mountain incident. Twelve miles northeast of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Labor Mountain, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles north of Cle Elum, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rattlesnake, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NW Team 7). CIMT is also managing the Lynx Mountain incident. Two miles west of Seven Bays, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Lynx Mountain, Colville Agency, BIA. Seven miles northwest of Inchelium, WA. Medium slash, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Crown Creek, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 12). CIMT (NR Team 6) mobilizing. CIMT is also managing the Katy Creek incident. One mile southeast of Marble, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Katy Creek, Colville NF, USFS. Six miles northwest of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Moon Complex (2 fires), Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 5). Thirty-five miles northwest of Grants Pass, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Tacoma Creek, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (GB Team 7). Started on private land 15 miles northwest of Cusick, WA. Timber, light slash and brush. Moderate fire behavior with group torching, short-range spotting and backing. Structures, communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Road closures in effect.

Wildcat, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 10). Thirty miles west of Naches, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with creeping, group torching, and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kelsey Peak, Medford District, BLM. CIMT (ODF Team 1). Fourteen miles west of Glendale, OR. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Emigrant, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 3). Twenty-four miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Medium slash, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bridge, Malheur NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 4). Ten miles northeast of Prairie City, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Foley Ridge, Willamette NF, USFS. Thirty-five miles west of Bend, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Tunnel Creek, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles southwest of Quilcene, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior. Trail closures in effect.

Martin, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Forty-five miles northwest of Chelan, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Bear Gulch, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Hoodport, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Perry, North Cascades NP, NPS. Sixteen miles northeast of Newhalem, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Low pressure will move across the Northwest into Montana on Sunday. This will bring a 5- to 10-degree drop in temperatures, higher RH, scattered showers and thunderstorms, and breezy winds from the Northwest to the Divide. Warmer and drier conditions will continue in California and the southern half of the Great Basin into the Southwest. Low pressure in the central Rockies will move northeast into the northern Plains. Widespread showers and thunderstorms will stretch across the Plains on Sunday with a marginal risk of severe weather, with widely scattered thunderstorms in Colorado and eastern Wyoming. RH of 25–30% and breezy south winds of 20–30 mph are expected across Texas and Oklahoma with elevated concerns. The drying trend will continue in the East with well above normal temperatures from the southern Plains east to the Mid-Atlantic and near-record heat in the Mississippi Valley with an increase in initial attack possible. Isolated thunderstorms may develop from the Mississippi Valley to the Tennessee Valley with strong heating. A cold front from Canada will move across the Northeast with a few light showers possible. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue across Florida.
