**Lower Sugarloaf**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Labor Mountain incident. Twelve miles northeast of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Labor Mountain**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles north of Cle Elum, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Moon Complex** (2 fires), Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 5). Thirty-five miles northwest of Grants Pass, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Rattlesnake**, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NW Team 7). CIMT (SA Team 3) mobilizing. CIMT is also managing the Lynx Mountain incident. Two miles west of Seven Bays, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Lynx Mountain**, Colville Agency, BIA. Seven miles northwest of Inchelium, WA. Medium slash, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Tacoma Creek**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (GB Team 7). Started on private land 15 miles northwest of Cusick, WA. Timber, light slash and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing and creeping. Communication and energy infrastructure threatened. Road closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Kelsey Peak**, Medford District, BLM. CIMT (ODF Team 1). Fourteen miles west of Glendale, OR. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Emigrant**, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 3). CIMT (RM Team 1) mobilizing. Twenty-four miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Medium slash, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Katy Creek**, Colville NF, USFS. Six miles northwest of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and single tree torching. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Crown Creek**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 12) to CIMT (NR Team 6) will occur today. CIMT is also managing the Katy Creek incident. One mile southeast of Marble, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and single tree torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Wildcat**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Transfer of command from (NW Team 10) back to the local unit will occur today. Thirty miles west of Naches, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, creeping and torching. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Bridge**, Malheur NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 4). Ten miles northeast of Prairie City, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Foley Ridge**, Willamette NF, USFS. Thirty-five miles west of Bend, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and isolated torching. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Tunnel Creek**, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles southwest of Quilcene, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Trail closures in effect.

**Martin**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Forty-five miles northwest of Chelan, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

High pressure amplifies along the West Coast with sharp warming and drying in the West, with above normal temperatures, low relative humidity and poor to moderate humidity recovery. Gusty east winds continue through Tuesday night in western Washington and begin to decrease during the day in western Oregon. Fire behavior will pick up on existing fires with an increase in initial attack possible from recent lightning.

Cooler temperatures, higher RH and scattered showers and thunderstorms continue across the Rockies east of the Divide, the Plains into New Mexico and the Texas Panhandle. Strong high pressure stretches from the Northeast and Great Lakes to the southern Plains with continued well above normal temperatures and low relative humidity. Isolated thunderstorms in the Lower Mississippi Valley with an uptick in initial attack. Low pressure continues in the Mid-Atlantic with scattered showers and thunderstorms from coastal Northeast south to the Mid-Atlantic and southern Appalachians. Scattered showers and thunderstorms continue in central and southern Florida.
