Lower Sugarloaf, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Labor Mountain incident. Twelve miles northeast of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and group torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Labor Mountain, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles north of Cle Elum, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and group torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Moon Complex (2 fires), Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). Thirty-five miles northwest of Grants Pass, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Lynx Mountain, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Rattlesnake incident. Seven miles northwest of Inchelium, WA. Medium slash, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Rattlesnake, Colville Agency, BIA. Two miles west of Seven Bays, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Crown Creek, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NR Team 6). CIMT is also managing the Katy Creek incident. One mile southeast of Marble, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Katy Creek, Colville NF, USFS. Six miles northwest of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with isolated torching and short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Emigrant, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 1). Twenty-four miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Medium slash, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Tacoma Creek, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Transfer of command from CIMT (GB Team 7) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Started on private land 15 miles northwest of Cusick, WA. Timber, light slash and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Road closures in effect.

Wildcat, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty miles west of Naches, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with backing, single tree torching and creeping. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Foley Ridge, Willamette NF, USFS. Thirty-five miles west of Bend, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Tunnel Creek, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles southwest of Quilcene, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with group torching, uphill runs and flanking. Trail closures in effect.

Martin, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Forty-five miles northwest of Chelan, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

Bear Gulch, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Hoodport, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kelsey Peak, Medford District, BLM. Fourteen miles west of Glendale, OR. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. No new information.

Perry, North Cascades NP, NPS. Sixteen miles northeast of Newhalem, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. No new information. Last report unless new information is received.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms and near to below normal temperatures will persist across Northern California into the Great Basin and Southwest, with the cooler temperatures and thunderstorms moving into the central Rockies, as well. Isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms are possible on the northern periphery of the moisture from southeast Oregon into southern Idaho. A cold front will move into western Washington overnight bringing showers, heaviest on the west slopes of the Olympics. Very warm and dry conditions with relative humidity as low as 10% will persist east of the front from eastern Washington into the northern Rockies, and west winds gusting 30-40 mph are expected in the afternoon across the Cascade Gaps and Columbia Basin. Breezy downslope westerly winds will also develop in north-central Montana late in the afternoon and overnight.

Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue across the central and southern Plains into the Great Lakes, while isolated thunderstorms persist in portions of the Southeast. Very dry conditions will persist from the Lower Mississippi and Ohio Valleys to much of the East Coast with relative humidity locally as low as 20%. Winds will be light overall, but locally breezy northwest winds gusting to 20 mph will continue in Maine.
