Lower Sugarloaf, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Labor Mountain incident. Twelve miles northeast of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and spotting. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Labor Mountain, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles north of Cle Elum, WA. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, wind driven runs and spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Moon Complex (2 fires), Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). Eleven miles northeast of Agness, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Lynx Mountain, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Rattlesnake incident. Seven miles northwest of Inchelium, WA. Medium slash, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Rattlesnake, Colville Agency, BIA. Two miles west of Seven Bays, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Crown Creek, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NR Team 6). CIMT is also managing the Katy Creek incident. One mile southeast of Marble, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Katy Creek, Colville NF, USFS. Six miles northwest of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Emigrant, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 1). Twenty-four miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Medium slash, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Tacoma Creek, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land 15 miles northwest of Cusick, WA. Timber, light slash and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Road closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Wildcat, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty miles west of Naches, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Foley Ridge, Willamette NF, USFS. Thirty-five miles west of Bend, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Martin, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Forty-five miles northwest of Chelan, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened. Evacuations, road and trail closures in effect.

Bear Gulch, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Hoodspport, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Hawk Creek**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Started on private land nine miles northwest of Davenport, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, wind-driven runs and spotting. Area and road closures in effect.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A cold front will move through the central Rockies and into the central and northern Plains with scattered showers and thunderstorms. The most widespread storms are expected on the central Plains where severe thunderstorms are possible, as well. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will also develop in the Southwest. Locally breezy north to northeasterly winds will develop in northern California and southwest Oregon today and tonight, with lower minimum relative humidity of 10-20% and poor overnight recovery for mid-slopes and ridges. Drier conditions will also return to the Northwest and northern Rockies, but with seasonable temperatures and relative humidity. Scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms will develop from the Mid-Mississippi and Ohio Valleys into the Great Lakes, bringing relief to the Ohio Valley's recent dry conditions. Dry conditions will persist in New England and the Southeast, but with higher relative humidity, above 30% and 40%, respectively.
