**Lower Sugarloaf**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 2). CIMT (NW Team 10) mobilizing. CIMT is also managing the Labor Mountain incident. Twelve miles northeast of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Labor Mountain**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12) mobilizing. Ten miles north of Cle Elum, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Moon Complex**, Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT (NW Team 7) mobilizing. Eleven miles northeast of Agness, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with backing, single tree torching and uphill runs. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Crown Creek**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Transfer of command from CIMT (NR Team 6) back to the local unit will occur today. CIMT is also managing the Katy Creek incident. One mile southeast of Marble, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

**Katy Creek**, Colville NF, USFS. Six miles northwest of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

**Emigrant**, Willamette NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 1). Twenty-four miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Medium slash, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with flanking, backing and short-range spotting. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Lynx Mountain**, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Rattlesnake incident. Seven miles northwest of Inchelium, WA. Brush, timber and medium slash. Active fire behavior with backing and smoldering. Road closures in effect.

**Rattlesnake**, Colville Agency, BIA. Two miles west of Seven Bays, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Road closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Wildcat**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty miles west of Naches, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, flanking and backing. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Foley Ridge**, Willamette NF, USFS. Thirty-five miles west of Bend, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Bear Gulch**, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Hoodspport, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

### **Predictive Services Discussion:**

A strong cold front will move into the northwestern US, with widespread rain and snow above 8,000 feet in northern California, the Northwest, northern Great Basin, and northern Rockies. However, portions of the east slopes of the Cascades and Columbia Basin will see little rainfall. Strong southwesterly winds will develop across much of the central and western Great Basin ahead of the front, but recent rainfall will mitigate the conditions. Breezy, warm, and dry southerly winds will develop on the central High Plains, as well. Dry conditions will persist on the Plains and Mississippi Valley into the Northeast, with well above normal temperatures in the northern Plains and Great Lakes. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected into the Carolinas due to a dying cold front and moisture from Tropical Storm Imelda.
