Six US Army HH-60 MEDEVAC Helicopters from the 1st Air Cavalry Brigade (Fort Hood, TX) have been deployed to California to support wildland fire operations nationally.

**Lower Sugarloaf**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 2) to CIMT (NW Team 10) will occur tomorrow. CIMT is also managing the Labor Mountain incident. Twelve miles northeast of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Labor Mountain**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12) mobilizing. Ten miles north of Cle Elum, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Moon Complex**, Rogue River-Siskiyou NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 13) to CIMT (NW Team 7) will occur tomorrow. Eleven miles northeast of Agness, OR. Timber, closed timber litter and hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Emigrant**, Willamette NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (RM Team 1) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Twenty-four miles southeast of Oakridge, OR. Medium slash, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with flanking, backing and short-range spotting. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Crown Creek**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. One mile southeast of Marble, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Katy Creek**, Colville NF, USFS. Six miles northwest of Kettle Falls, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Wildcat**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty miles west of Naches, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with wind-driven runs, flanking and backing. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Lynx Mountain**, Colville Agency, BIA. Transfer of command from CIMT (SA Team 3) back to the local unit will occur today. Seven miles northwest of Inchelium, WA. Brush, timber and medium slash. Active fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Road closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Bear Gulch**, Olympic NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Hoodspport, WA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Foley Ridge**, Willamette NF, USFS. Thirty-five miles west of Bend, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

### **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Widespread showers and isolated thunderstorms will continue across the northwestern US today, with snow expected in the higher elevations. However, portions of the east slopes of the Cascades and Columbia Basin will see little rainfall. Breezy southwesterly winds will develop across much of the central and western Great Basin ahead of the front, but recent rainfall will mitigate the conditions. Breezy, warm, and dry southerly winds will develop on much of the central and northern High Plains, as well. Dry conditions will persist on the Plains and Mississippi Valley into the Great Lakes, with well above normal temperatures in the northern Plains and Great Lakes. A dry cold front will pass through the Northeast today, with breezy and dry northwest winds developing behind the front in the afternoon. Isolated showers and thunderstorms are expected in the Carolinas due to moisture from Hurricane Imelda, with gusty northeast winds, high surf, and localized coastal flooding along the East Coast.
