## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Breezy to strong southwest winds will develop across eastern New Mexico into West Texas this afternoon amid relative humidity of 10-18% creating elevated to critical conditions. Breezy to strong west winds will continue across the Greater Four Corners northwestward into the Great Basin, but relative humidity will be elevated with areas of precipitation mitigating the wind. Strong to severe thunderstorms will develop across the southern half of the Plains east of the dry line, with widespread precipitation across the northern Plains to the Midwest, falling as snow in much of the Dakotas to Minnesota and the Upper Great Lakes. Widespread precipitation is also expected across the northwestern U.S., with snow levels falling to 2,000 to 4,000 feet overnight. Locally breezy southwest winds will continue in the Piedmont, but relative humidity is expected to remain above critical levels, while isolated showers and thunderstorms develop again in the Lower Mississippi Valley. Near to slightly below normal temperatures will continue across Alaska with mainly dry conditions, while lighter trade winds are expected in Hawai'i.
