\* **Hilux**, Big Cypress National Preserve, NPS. Five miles southeast of Miles City, FL. Southern rough and timber. Moderate fire behavior with running and backing. Numerous structures threatened.

**Sargent**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Active fire behavior with torching, spotting and running. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

\* **Wildwood**, George Washington & Jefferson NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Catawba, VA. Closed timber litter, hardwood litter and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and uphill runs.

\* **North Twin**, Texas A&M Forest Service. Two miles northeast of Bugbee, TX. Brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

**139**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

**Mill Pond**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

\* **Troupville Again**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Two miles west of Valdosta, GA. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

**Slover Rd**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Four miles southwest of Jesup, GA. Southern rough and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

**Woodlawn**, Francis Marion & Sumter NF, USFS. Six miles north of Evans, SC. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Double Pine**, Oklahoma DOF. Two miles northwest of Muldrow, OK. Heavy slash. Minimal fire behavior.

\* **South Twin**, Lake Meredith National Recreation Area, NPS. Two miles northwest of Sanford, TX. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Roosevelt Spain Road**, North Carolina Forest Service. Started on private land five miles northwest of Greenville, NC. Timber. Active fire behavior with running. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

**Jumping Branch**, North Carolina Forest Service. Started on private land four miles northwest of Marion, NC. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping. Residences threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

\* **Ivy Gap Road**, Kentucky DOF. Started on private land seven miles west of Hazard, KY. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking and backing. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Breezy and dry west to northwest winds of 10-20 mph with gusts to 30 mph amid relative humidity of 15-30% will develop in the central and southern Appalachians to the Piedmont, strongest in Virginia, creating localized elevated conditions. Showers and thunderstorms will develop along a cold front as it moves through Florida, with the heaviest rain likely on the central and southern portions of the peninsula. A mainly dry cold front will move through the Great Lakes and Mid-Mississippi Valley into the Northeast and Appalachians overnight, with mixed precipitation mainly falling in the Great Lakes and Northeast. Breezy and dry southerly return flow winds will develop across northeast New Mexico into the Texas and Oklahoma panhandles creating elevated conditions. Isolated showers and thunderstorms are likely to develop from the Mogollon Rim to the West Texas mountains. Mild conditions are expected across the northern half of the West, with isolated showers and thunderstorms possible from the central Oregon Cascades into central Idaho. Near normal temperatures and dry conditions are expected across most of Alaska but light showers will move into portions of southwest and south-central Alaska. Lighter trade winds in Hawai'i will veer more to the southeast today, with a few light windward showers.
