\* **STE Alum**, Daniel Boone NF, USFS. Three miles west of Whitley City, KY. Timber. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and backing. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

\* **Hwy 351 Dixie**, Florida Forest Service. Eight miles southwest of Cross City, FL. Southern rough. Active fire behavior with running. Road closures in effect.

**Hilux**, Big Cypress National Preserve, NPS. Five miles southeast of Miles City, FL. Southern rough and timber. Moderate fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened.

**Sargent**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with backing and creeping. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

\* **Sunny**, Osage Agency, BIA. Nine miles northeast of Pawhuska, OK. Grass, timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and backing. Structures threatened.

**Williams Creek**, National Forests in Alabama, USFS. Fourteen miles southeast of Centreville, AL. Timber, brush and heavy slash. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened.

\* **Odell**, Osage Agency, BIA. Two miles east of Osage, OK. Grass, timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and spotting.

\* **Brushy Mountain**, Oklahoma DOF. Eleven miles west of Heavener, OK. Hardwood litter and grass. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and backing.

**Rosindale Road**, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

An upper-level trough will move through the Intermountain West, with scattered showers from the Greater Four Corners north to the Canadian border, mainly west of the Divide with snow levels 5,000 to 7,000 feet. Breezy westerly winds 15-30 mph with gusts to 45 mph amid relative humidity of 8-20% will develop across much of the central and southern High Plains west of the dry line creating elevated to critical conditions. Isolated thunderstorms will develop ahead of the dry line in the central and southern Plains, with more widespread showers and thunderstorms, some severe, in the Upper Midwest. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will also develop in the Adirondacks to northern New England. Well ahead of the front, breezy southwest winds 10-20 mph with gusts to 30 mph will develop amid relative humidity of 20-30% in the central and southern Appalachians to the Piedmont creating elevated conditions. Dry conditions will persist across Florida but minimum relative humidity is expected to remain above 40%. Scattered light mixed precipitation showers will continue in south-central Alaska and the central and eastern Interior amid below normal temperatures. Locally heavy showers are expected near Kauai and Oahu today, while the eastern Hawai'ian Islands are drier.
