* **Newman Dr**, Florida Forest Service. Twelve miles northeast of Naples, FL. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with running and long-range spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Hilux, Big Cypress National Preserve, NPS. Five miles southeast of Miles City, FL. Southern rough and timber. Moderate fire behavior. Numerous structures threatened.

Sargent, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Sunny, Osage Agency, BIA. Nine miles northeast of Pawhuska, OK. Grass, timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and backing. Structures threatened.

STE Alum, Daniel Boone NF, USFS. Three miles west of Whitley City, KY. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Odell, Osage Agency, BIA. Two miles east of Osage, OK. Grass, timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and backing.

139, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching and creeping.

Rosindale Road, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Mill Pond, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

* **Ciba Road**, Alabama Forestry Commission. Thirty-one miles east of McIntosh, AL. Brush. Minimal fire behavior.

* **Scott Mountain**, Alabama Forestry Commission. Eighteen miles west of Butler, AL. Brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Williams Creek, National Forests in Alabama, USFS. Fourteen miles southeast of Centreville, AL. Timber, brush and heavy slash. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Hwy 351 Dixie, Florida Forest Service. Eight miles southwest of Cross City, FL. Southern rough. No new information.

Brushy Mountain, Oklahoma DOF. Eleven miles west of Heavener, OK. Hardwood litter and grass. No new information.

Paint Creek, Alabama Forestry Commission. Ten miles northwest of Weogufka, AL. Brush. No new information.

Rafey, Alabama Forestry Commission. Thirty-three miles north of Citronelle, AL. Brush. No new information.

Glen Ferris, West Virginia DOF. One mile southwest of Gauley Bridge, WV. Hardwood litter. No new information.

Batoff, West Virginia DOF. One mile northeast of Piney View, WV. Hardwood litter. No new information.
