Appalachia, Cherokee NF, USFS. Eight miles north of Ducktown, TN. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing and flanking. Railroad infrastructure threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

* **Conner Nelson Rd 45**, Florida Forest Service. Sixteen miles northwest of Jacksonville, FL. Southern rough and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, long-range spotting and short-range spotting. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

Woodbury, South Carolina Forestry Commission. Ten miles east of Hemingway, SC. Southern rough and timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping. Residences threatened.

SR 26, Florida Forest Service. Six miles east of Gainesville, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

* **Neon White**, Texas A&M Forest Service. Started on private land 17 miles northeast of Spur, TX. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs and running.

McGarrh, Georgia Forestry Commission. Three miles west of Summertown, GA. Timber. Active fire behavior with torching, backing and creeping.

Old Orangeburg, South Carolina Forestry Commission. Five miles southwest of Estill, SC. Timber and southern rough. Active fire behavior with creeping.

STE Alum, Daniel Boone NF, USFS. Three miles west of Whitley City, KY. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

139, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

Mill Pond, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

Rosindale Road, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Sargent, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and short-range spotting. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Newman Dr, Florida Forest Service. Twelve miles northwest of Naples, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and backing. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Breezy and dry northwest winds will develop behind a cold front across much of the Ohio Valley to the Southeast amid relative humidity of 12-25%. The strongest winds are expected in the Upper Ohio Valley to the Piedmont, with local wind gusts exceeding 40 mph along the east slopes of the Appalachians. Breezy and dry southerly winds will develop across eastern New Mexico and the Texas Panhandle amid relative humidity of 10-20% creating elevated to critical conditions, while very low humidity of 5-10% returned to eastern Colorado. Mild and dry conditions are expected across much of the Intermountain West, while showers are expected to move into northwestern California overnight. A strong storm will move through the southern half of Alaska with areas of strong winds and mixed precipitation as temperatures remain below normal. Light sea breeze winds are expected in Hawai'i, with an increase in showers as a cold front approaches the island chain.
