\* **HWY 82**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land one mile east of Atkinson, GA. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, long-range spotting and group torching. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

**Pineland Rd**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Thirteen miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, spotting and group torching. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations in effect.

\* **MM 45 Broward 06**, Florida Forest Service. Twenty-seven miles north of Homestead, FL. Brush. Extreme fire behavior with running.

\* **Cow Creek**, Florida Forest Service. Eleven miles south of Bronson, FL. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with running, long-range spotting and crowning. Structures threatened. Evacuations, road and trail closures in effect.

**Railroad**, Florida Forest Service. Ten miles north of Palatka, FL. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with short-range spotting, running and wind-driven runs. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened.

\* **Gun Range**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). One mile southwest of Water Town, FL. Southern Rough. Active fire behavior with backing and flanking.

**N Main St 2**, Florida Forest Service. Thirty-six miles north of Ocala, FL. Timber and southern rough. Active fire behavior with backing, short-range spotting and creeping. Numerous residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

\* **Georgia 46**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land five miles east of Soperton, GA. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, short-range spotting and group torching. Structures threatened.

**SR 26**, Florida Forest Service. Six miles east of Gainesville, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

**139**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

**Mill Pond**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

**STE Alum**, Daniel Boone NF, USFS. Three miles west of Whitley City, KY. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Trail closures in effect.

**Conner Nelson Rd 45**, Florida Forest Service. Sixteen miles northwest of Jacksonville, FL. Southern rough and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping. Road closures in effect.

**Sand Beach**, Florida Forest Service. Two miles east of Creel, FL. Hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping.

**Rosindale Road**, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

**Rafey**, Alabama Forestry Commission. Thirty-three miles north of Citronelle, AL. Brush. Minimal fire behavior.  
**Ciba Road**, Alabama Forestry Commission. Thirty-one miles east of McIntosh, AL. Brush. Minimal fire behavior.

**Crews Rd 10**, Florida Forest Service. Twenty-three miles northeast of Green Cove Springs, FL. Timber and southern rough. No new information.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Widespread elevated to critical conditions due to west to southwesterly winds 15-30 mph with gusts 30-55 mph will develop across all the High Plains, the Greater Four Corners, the Northern Plains, and Minnesota. Moisture will move north across the central and southern Plains with higher relative humidity, but the moisture will be more limited on the central High Plains and will result in isolated dry thunderstorms in the afternoon. Very dry conditions will persist in the Southeast with minimum relative humidity of 15-30% but winds will be lighter today outside of sea breezes that develop off the Gulf and Atlantic coasts. However, breezy west winds are expected in portions of the Mid-Atlantic and the Piedmont. Widespread precipitation will fall across the northern half of the West, with snow falling above 5,000 to 6,000 feet. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will also develop in portions of East Texas and Louisiana, with scattered light precipitation in the Northeast from a passing cold front. Below normal temperatures are expected to persist across Alaska today, while breezy trade winds and drier conditions return to Hawai'i.
