**HWY 82**, Georgia Forestry Commission. CIMT (SA Team 1). Started on private land one mile east of Atkinson, GA. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, short-range spotting and torching. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

**Pineland Rd**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Thirteen miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with torching, wind-driven runs and spotting. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened. Road closures in effect.

**Cow Creek**, Florida Forest Service. Eleven miles south of Bronson, FL. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with backing, crowning and short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

**Gun Range**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Sand Drain and Griffis incidents. One mile southwest of Water Town, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Sand Drain**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Eighteen miles northeast of Olustee, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Griffis**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles northeast of Olustee, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**139**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

**Railroad**, Florida Forest Service. Ten miles north of Palatka, FL. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running and flanking. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened.

**MM 45 Broward 06**, Florida Forest Service. Twenty-seven miles north of Homestead, FL. Brush. Moderate fire behavior with running.

**Sargent**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and torching. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

**SR 26**, Florida Forest Service. Six miles east of Gainesville, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened.

**Mill Pond**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

**Conner Nelson Rd 45**, Florida Forest Service. Four miles northwest of Hilliard, FL. Southern rough and timber. Minimal fire behavior with short-range spotting and single tree torching.

**N Main St 2**, Florida Forest Service. Thirty-six miles north of Ocala, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

**Rosindale Road**, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

**Sand Beach**, Florida Forest Service. Two miles east of Creel, FL. Hardwood litter. No new information.

**Rafey**, Alabama Forestry Commission. Thirty-three miles north of Citronelle, AL. Brush. No new information. Last narrative report unless new information is received.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Widespread elevated to critical are expected across the Greater Four Corners into the central and southern High Plains today as westerly winds of 15-25 mph and gusts to 40 mph develop amid relative humidity of 5-15%. The strongest winds and lowest humidity are most likely in eastern Colorado to northeast New Mexico. Mild and dry conditions are expected across the Northwest while cool temperatures and scattered snow showers continue across Montana and Wyoming. Very dry conditions will persist in the Southeast with minimum relative humidity of 20-30% but winds will remain light outside of sea breezes that develop near the Gulf and Atlantic coasts. Locally breezy and dry northwest winds will continue across New England, while dry northwest winds are expected in Minnesota but will be weaker than yesterday. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop ahead of a cold front from East Texas to the Great Lakes, with a few severe thunderstorms likely in the Lower Mississippi Valley. Seasonable temperatures are expected in Alaska with mostly dry conditions while breezy trade winds continue in Hawai'i.
