HWY 82, Georgia Forestry Commission. CIMT (SA Team 1). Started on private land one mile east of Atkinson, GA. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, long-range spotting and torching. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Pineland Rd, Georgia Forestry Commission. Thirteen miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, torching and spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Gun Range, National Forests in Florida, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Sand Drain and Griffis incidents. One mile southwest of Water Town, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Sand Drain, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Eighteen miles northeast of Olustee, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior.

Griffis, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles northeast of Olustee, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior.

Railroad, Florida Forest Service. Ten miles north of Palatka, FL. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and smoldering. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened.

139, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

Cow Creek, Florida Forest Service. Eleven miles south of Bronson, FL. Southern rough. Active fire behavior with flanking, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

Sargent, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and torching. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

SR 26, Florida Forest Service. Six miles east of Gainesville, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping. Structures threatened.

N Main St 2, Florida Forest Service. Thirty-six miles north of Ocala, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering.

Mill Pond, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

Rosindale Road, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Sand Beach, Florida Forest Service. Two miles east of Creel, FL. Hardwood litter. No new information. Last narrative report unless new information is received.

Murphy, South Dakota Division of Wildland Fire. Two miles northwest of Hermosa, SD. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened.

Taber Rec, Bon Homme County. Ten miles south of Taber, SD. Grass and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs and spotting.

* **Bauman**, Pine Ridge Agency, BIA. Twelve miles east of Wanblee, SD. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened.

* **Poitrey Canyon**, Las Animas County. Six miles west of Villegreen, CO. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running and single tree torching.

* **Arthur McPherson**, Nebraska Forest Service. Forty-three miles northwest of North Platte, NE. Grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Widespread elevated to locally critical conditions are expected across the Greater Four Corners into the southern High Plains today as westerly winds of 15-20 mph and gusts to 30 mph develop amid relative humidity of 5-15%. Mild and dry conditions are expected across the Northwest while scattered showers, isolated thunderstorms, and high elevation snow move through California, the Great Basin, and northwest Arizona. Dry conditions will persist along the southeastern coastal plain with minimum relative humidity of 20-30%, while scattered showers and thunderstorms develop from the Tennessee Valley to the northern Gulf Coast, with isolated thunderstorms across Florida. Due to the ongoing drought, new ignitions are possible if not likely, especially in areas that receive little rainfall. Farther north, showers and thunderstorms will move through the Mid-Atlantic, while isolated thunderstorms develop across the central Plains, with severe thunderstorms likely in eastern Oklahoma. Seasonable temperatures are expected in Alaska with mostly dry conditions while breezy trade winds continue in Hawai'i.
