**HWY 82**, Georgia Forestry Commission. CIMT (SA Team 1). Started on private land one mile east of Atkinson, GA. Southern rough, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

**Pineland Rd**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Thirteen miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, spotting and flanking. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

**Gun Range**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Sand Drain and Griffis incidents. One mile southwest of Water Town, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Sand Drain**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Eighteen miles northeast of Olustee, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Griffis**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles northeast of Olustee, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

**Railroad**, Florida Forest Service. Ten miles north of Palatka, FL. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and smoldering. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened.

**139**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

**Sargent**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

**SR 26**, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land six miles east of Gainesville, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened.

**N Main St 2**, Florida Forest Service. Thirty-six miles north of Ocala, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering.

**Rosindale Road**, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

**Mill Pond**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

**Cow Creek**, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land 11 miles south of Bronson, FL. Timber and southern rough. No new information.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Widespread elevated to critical conditions are expected across the Greater Four Corners into the southern High Plains tomorrow as west to southwest winds of 15-25 mph with gusts 35-45 mph develop amid minimum relative humidity of 5–15%. Farther north, scattered showers spread across the Great Basin and central/northern Rockies, with snow above 6,000 to 7,000 feet. East of the Rockies, scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop from the central Plains into the Mid-Mississippi Valley and Great Lakes, with severe thunderstorms likely in the Mid-Mississippi Valley. Dry conditions and light winds are expected across the Appalachians to the East Coast today, but relative humidity will be higher and above 30% except in portions of South Georgia. Seasonable conditions are expected across Alaska with scattered showers for south-central Alaska and the western Interior, while Hawai'i remains under moderate trade winds with a few windward showers.
