HWY 82, Georgia Forestry Commission. CIMT (SA Team 1). Started on private land one mile east of Atkinson, GA. Southern rough, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Pineland Rd, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land 13 miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, spotting and isolated torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Gun Range, National Forests in Florida, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Sand Drain incident. One mile southwest of Water Town, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Sand Drain, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Eighteen miles northeast of Olustee, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

HWY 41, Everglades National Park, NPS. Six miles west of Miami, FL. Grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with wind-driven runs. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

139, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

Railroad, Florida Forest Service. Ten miles north of Palatka, FL. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and backing. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened.

Cow Creek, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land 11 miles south of Bronson, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and creeping. Structures threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

Sargent, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

SR 26, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land six miles east of Gainesville, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened.

N Main St 2, Florida Forest Service. Thirty-six miles north of Ocala, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Rosindale Road, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

* **Shady Grove**, Alabama Forestry Commission. Thirteen miles west of Hatchechubbee, AL. Brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Warm and dry conditions will continue west of the Divide in the Southwest and minimum relative humidity drops to 7-15% but winds will be light. Upslope flow across the central and southern High Plains will bring higher relative humidity with scattered showers and thunderstorms, and snow possible near the Continental Divide in Colorado. A stalled cold front will result in scattered showers and thunderstorms from central Texas to along the northern Gulf Coast, bringing temporary relief to the drought-stricken areas of South Georgia and the Florida Panhandle. A cold front will move through the Northeast with areas of rain, heaviest in Maine, while isolated showers are expected in the Great Lakes. Warm and dry conditions are expected across the Northwest today as high pressure builds off the British Columbia coast. Slightly below normal temperatures are expected across Alaska while a storm in the Aleutians brings precipitation to the western half of the state. A moist trade wind pattern is expected across Hawai'i with scattered to numerous windward showers and isolated leeward showers.
