One 15-member incident management team and 59 fireline management personnel from Australia and New Zealand are assigned to support large fires in the Northwest Area.

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Air Force Reserve, CO) have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR. One MAFFS C-130 airtanker from the 153rd Airlift Wing (WY Air National Guard) and one MAFFS C-130 airtanker from the 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) and respective support personnel have been deployed to Redding, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Old Trails, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (CA Team 7). CIMT is also managing the Autumn Lane and Fairview incidents. Three miles west of Spokane, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking and backing. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Autumn Lane, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seven miles northwest of Spokane, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, road and trail closures in effect.

Fairview, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Two miles northeast of Spokane, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Bradeen Hill, Mitre Rock and Hudspeth incidents. Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Bradeen Hill, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seventeen miles southwest of Colville, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, short-range spotting and smoldering. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Mitre Rock, Spokane Agency, BIA. Nineteen miles northwest of Davenport, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Hudspeth, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Three miles southeast of Hunters, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with torching, short-range spotting and flanking. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (Cal Fire Team 4). One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Grass and timber. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, group torching and long-range spotting. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 6). Three miles north of Sportsman Park, OR. Timber, hardwood litter and grass. Active fire behavior with flanking, uphill runs and short-range spotting. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, uphill runs and long-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (AK Team 2). One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and short-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 7) to CIMT (NR Team 6) will occur tomorrow. CIMT is also managing the Hagen and Horse Ridge incidents. Eighteen miles east of Milton-Freewater, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with backing, torching and spotting. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and spotting. Numerous residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Horse Ridge, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Hat, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (CA Team 5). CIMT is also managing the Big Grass incident. Forty miles east of Burns, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Big Grass, Vale District, BLM. Twenty-five miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, wind-driven runs and single tree torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (2 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Castle, Umpqua NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 3). Twenty-three miles northeast of Tiller, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, uphill runs and short-range spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Second Flat, Burns District, BLM. CIMT (CA Team 4). CIMT is also managing the Coleman Creek incident. Six miles northeast of Riley, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with wind-driven runs, creeping and smoldering. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coleman Creek, Burns District, BLM. Eight miles east of Juntura, OR. Grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, short-range spotting and running. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

0587 Shingle, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (GB Team 5). CIMT is also managing the Coyote and Henry incidents. Fourteen miles southeast of Mitchell, OR. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. Five miles south of Post, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Henry, Prineville District, BLM. Five miles south of Paulina Guard Station, OR. Brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Powder River, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Fox and Bob Creek incidents. Four miles southwest of Richland, OR. Grass, closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Evacuations in effect.

Fox, Vale District, BLM. Twelve miles northeast of Huntington, OR. Grass and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and short-range spotting. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bob Creek, Vale District, BLM. One mile north of Oxbow, OR. Grass, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Bench, Warm Springs Agency, BIA. CIMT (SW Team 4). CIMT is also managing the 0658 Round Butte incident. Four miles south of Warm Springs, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

0658 Round Butte, Ochoco NF, USFS. Ten miles west of Madras, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (FL State Team 1). CIMT is also managing the I5 MM 57 Nb incident. Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Closed timber litter, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with backing and smoldering.

I5 MM 57 Nb, Grants Pass Unit, Oregon DOF. One mile east of Grants Pass, OR. Timber, hardwood litter and grass. Minimal fire behavior with backing and smoldering. Residences threatened.

Ptarmigan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. NIMO Team 3. Twenty miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, wind-driven runs and backing. Structures threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

Jackass Butte, Burns District, BLM. Transfer of command from CIMT (SA Team 2) back to the local unit will occur today. CIMT is also managing the Bald Mountain, Stubble and Crater incidents. Forty miles south of Burns, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened.

Bald Mountain, Burns District, BLM. Fifty miles southeast of Burns, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Stubble, Malheur NWR, FWS. Fifteen miles southwest of Lawen, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Crater, Burns District, BLM. Thirty-five miles south of Burns, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Skyo, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Three miles southwest of Packwood, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Residences threatened. Evacuations and area closures in effect.

Burnt Creek, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles north of Enterprise, OR. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Salmon, Umatilla NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and single tree torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Olive Butte, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Akawa Butte, Sisters Unit, Oregon DOF. Thirteen miles northeast of Sisters, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Eggo, Wallowa Unit, Oregon DOF. Seventeen miles northeast of Enterprise, OR. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

Border 2, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Thirty-six miles northeast of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, short-range spotting and group torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Luna, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Ten miles north of Newhalem, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with group torching and flanking. Structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Egypt, Malheur NF, USFS. Twelve miles north of Riley, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Anthony, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 13) back to the local unit will occur today. Thirty-four miles north of Baker City, OR. Closed timber litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching, creeping and running. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bologna, Umatilla NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Kimberly, OR. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Mccullough Rd, Yakama Agency, BIA. One mile south of Union Gap, WA. Grass and brush. No new information. Last narrative report unless new information is received.

Predictive Services Discussion:

8/5/2026 Breezy west winds 12-20 mph with gusts 20-30 mph amid relative humidity 4-10% will develop along the Sierra Front and from the central Great Basin to the West Slope and southwest Wyoming. Temperatures will continue to be hot in the southern half of the West, with above normal temperatures in the northern half of the West, as well, as temperatures near 100°F expected in the Willamette Valley. Very low relative humidity 4-15% is also expected in much of California to the Inland Northwest and northern Rockies, and overnight recovery will be poor and less than 30% for most mid-slopes and ridges. Locally gusty east winds up to 30 mph are expected in the Columbia Gorge in the morning before weakening in the afternoon. The southern Plains will also experience extreme heat near 105°F, with locally breezy south winds and low relative humidity. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop in southeast Arizona, with isolated dry thunderstorms possible in northern New Mexico to extreme southern Colorado. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are also expected in Florida, bringing some short-term relief to the ongoing drought. Showers and thunderstorms will develop from the central Plains to the Great Lakes along a cold front, with isolated showers and thunderstorms from the Appalachians to the East Coast. Above normal temperatures will continue across eastern Alaska today, with dry conditions expected to persist through the weekend.
