One 15-member incident management team and 59 fireline management personnel from Australia and New Zealand are assigned to support large fires in the Northwest Area.

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Air Force Reserve, CO) have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR. Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers from the 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) and respective support personnel have been deployed to Redding, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

On August 6, a dozer operator was fatally injured while engaged in firefighting operations on the Wrights Spring fire outside Chiloquin, OR. The wildland firefighting community extends its condolences to the friends and family of the deceased.

On August 7, a helicopter on contract with the United States Forest Service was involved in an accident on the Widemouth 2 Fire outside of Kanosh, UT. The pilot and one crewmember were fatally injured. The wildland fire community extends its condolences to the friends and family of the deceased.

Wrights Spring, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). Two miles southeast of Chiloquin, OR. Timber, chaparral and grass. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, wind-driven runs and group torching. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 6). Ten miles east of Government Camp, OR. Timber, hardwood litter and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, short-range spotting and flanking. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Old Trails, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (CA Team 7). CIMT is also managing the Autumn Lane and Fairview incidents. Three miles west of Spokane, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Autumn Lane, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seven miles northwest of Spokane, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and smoldering. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Fairview, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Two miles northeast of Spokane, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). CIMT (NW Team 12) mobilizing. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, uphill runs and long-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (Cal Fire Team 4). One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Grass and timber. Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching and spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (2 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and spotting. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 6). CIMT is also managing the Hagen incident. Eighteen miles east of Milton-Freewater, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and spotting. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and spotting. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (AK Team 2). One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and short-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Powder River, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Fox incident. Four miles southwest of Richland, OR. Grass, closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Evacuations in effect.

Fox, Vale District, BLM. Twelve miles northeast of Huntington, OR. Grass and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with backing, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Bradeen Hill, Mitre Rock and Hudspeth incidents. Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with flanking, group torching and uphill runs. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Bradeen Hill, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seventeen miles southwest of Colville, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Mitre Rock, Spokane Agency, BIA. Nineteen miles northwest of Davenport, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Hudspeth, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Three miles southeast of Hunters, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, backing and isolated torching. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

0587 Shingle, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (GB Team 5). CIMT is also managing the Coyote incident. Fourteen miles southeast of Mitchell, OR. Grass and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. Five miles south of Post, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Second Flat, Burns District, BLM. CIMT (CA Team 4). CIMT is also managing the Coleman Creek incident. Six miles northeast of Riley, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coleman Creek, Burns District, BLM. Eight miles east of Juntura, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Bench, Warm Springs Agency, BIA. CIMT (SW Team 4). Four miles south of Warm Springs, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Critical infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. Transfer of command from CIMT (FL State Team 1) back to the local unit occurred yesterday. Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Closed timber litter, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and backing. Communication infrastructure threatened.

I5 MM 57 Nb, Grants Pass Unit, Oregon DOF. One mile east of Grants Pass, OR. Timber, hardwood litter and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and backing. Residences threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Ptarmigan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. NIMO Team 3. Twenty miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber, medium slash and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Castle, Umpqua NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles northeast of Tiller, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, uphill runs and short-range spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

High Lava, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Stabler, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Luna, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Ten miles north of Newhalem, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with group torching and flanking. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Bald Mountain, Burns District, BLM. Fifty miles southeast of Burns, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Skyo, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Three miles southwest of Packwood, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and torching. Residences threatened. Area closures in effect.

Burnt Creek, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles north of Enterprise, OR. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Salmon, Umatilla NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Eggo, Wallowa Unit, Oregon DOF. Seventeen miles northeast of Enterprise, OR. Grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

Border 2, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Thirty-six miles northeast of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and uphill runs. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Egypt, Malheur NF, USFS. Twelve miles north of Riley, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior.

* **Prairie Mountain**, Northwest Region, Washington DNR. Eight miles northeast of Darrington, WA. Heavy slash and timber. Active fire behavior. Area and road closures in effect.

* **Grand Park 2**, Mount Rainier National Park, NPS. Seven miles southwest of Snoquera, WA. Timber. Extreme fire behavior with group torching and long-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Woodrat Mountain, Medford District, BLM. Six miles south of Jacksonville, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Numerous structures threatened.

Cottonwood, John Day Unit, Oregon DOF. Fifteen miles southwest of Long Creek, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13) mobilizing. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with short-range spotting, wind-driven runs and uphill runs. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Ransier, Yakama Agency, BIA. Two miles south of White Swan, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Olive Butte, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Hat, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (CA Team 5). CIMT is also managing the Big Grass incident. Forty miles east of Burns, OR. Grass and brush. No new information.

Big Grass, Vale District, BLM. Twenty-five miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, short-range spotting and single tree torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Elevated to locally critical conditions persist across the northern half of the West today. Hot, unstable conditions with 3-15% RH and poor overnight recovery will lead to extended burn periods. Breezy westerly winds will gust between 25 and 40 mph across much of the Northwest; strongest in the Cascade Gaps and along the northern Sierra Front. While cooler air is filtering west of the Cascades and lowering temperatures slightly in the Upper Columbia Basin, maximum temperatures will still exceed 100°F in lower elevations across California, the Great Basin, the central Rockies, the central and southern Plains, and the Southwest. Wet thunderstorm coverage remains well below average in the Southwest, with activity focused along the Mogollon Rim and southeast Arizona. However, there is concern for isolated dry lightning this afternoon extending into the central Sierra, southern Nevada, southern Utah, northern Arizona, and parts of central and northern New Mexico.

Elsewhere, the eastern U.S. will see near-normal temperatures, while increased cloud cover and scattered thunderstorms bring slightly below-normal temperatures to the Lower Mississippi Valley and Gulf Coast. Warm, dry conditions continue in eastern Alaska, maintaining elevated potential in the Upper Tanana Valley. Additionally, critically dry fuels combined with hot, dry, and breezy conditions will result in high-risk significant fire potential in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.
