Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Air Force Reserve, CO) have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR. Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers from the 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) and respective support personnel have been deployed to Redding, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Wrights Spring, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). Two miles west of Sprague River, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, short crown runs and long-range spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (CA Team 2) to CIMT (NW Team 12) will occur tomorrow. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, long-range spotting and uphill runs. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 6). Ten miles east of Government Camp, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with flanking, uphill runs and short-range spotting. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hat, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (CA Team 5). CIMT (NW Team 10) mobilizing. CIMT is also managing the Big Grass incident. Forty miles east of Burns, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Big Grass, Vale District, BLM. Twenty-five miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, short-range spotting and single tree torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (2 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs and spotting. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 6). CIMT is also managing the Hagen incident. Eighteen miles east of Milton-Freewater, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running, short-range spotting and uphill runs. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and spotting. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (Cal Fire Team 4). One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Grass and timber. Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching and spotting. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (AK Team 2). One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and short-range spotting. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Bradeen Hill, Mitre Rock and Hudspeth incidents. Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with flanking, group torching and uphill runs. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Bradeen Hill, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seventeen miles southwest of Colville, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Mitre Rock, Spokane Agency, BIA. Nineteen miles northwest of Davenport, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Hudspeth, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Three miles southeast of Hunters, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Old Trails, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (CA Team 7). CIMT is also managing the Autumn Lane and Fairview incidents. Three miles west of Spokane, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Autumn Lane, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seven miles northwest of Spokane, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Fairview, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Two miles northeast of Spokane, WA. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

0587 Shingle, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (GB Team 5). CIMT is also managing the Coyote incident. Fourteen miles southeast of Mitchell, OR. Grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. Five miles south of Post, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Powder River, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Fox incident. Four miles southwest of Richland, OR. Grass, closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Evacuations in effect.

Fox, Vale District, BLM. Twelve miles northeast of Huntington, OR. Grass and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Second Flat, Burns District, BLM. CIMT (CA Team 4). CIMT is also managing the Coleman Creek incident. Six miles northeast of Riley, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coleman Creek, Burns District, BLM. Eight miles east of Juntura, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bench, Warm Springs Agency, BIA. CIMT (SW Team 4). Four miles south of Warm Springs, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Critical infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Ptarmigan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. NIMO Team 3. Twenty miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber, medium slash and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13) mobilizing. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, brush and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, wind-driven runs and short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grand Park 2, Mount Rainier National Park, NPS. Seven miles southwest of Snoquera, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with isolated torching and spotting. Structures threatened.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Closed timber litter, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and backing.

Castle, Umpqua NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles northeast of Tiller, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Prairie Mountain, Northwest Region-Department of Natural Resources, Washington DNR. Four miles east of Mansford, WA. Heavy slash and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing and short-range spotting. Area and road closures in effect.

Cottonwood, John Day Unit, Oregon DOF. Fifteen miles southwest of Long Creek, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with short-range spotting. Residences threatened.

High Lava, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Stabler, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Luna, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Ten miles north of Newhalem, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with group torching and flanking. Structures threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Bald Mountain, Burns District, BLM. Fifty miles southeast of Burns, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened.

Burnt Creek, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles north of Enterprise, OR. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Salmon, Umatilla NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Eggo, Wallowa Unit, Oregon DOF. Seventeen miles northeast of Enterprise, OR. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened.

Border 2, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Thirty-six miles northeast of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Nunamaker Road**, Spokane District, BLM. Ten miles south of Washtucna, WA. Brush and grass. Active fire behavior with running and flanking. Energy infrastructure threatened. Road closures in effect.

* **Little Goose**, Washington State Fire Marshal's Office. Eighteen miles north of Dayton, WA. Grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, short-range spotting and flanking. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Skyo, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Three miles southwest of Packwood, WA. Timber. No new information.

Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Tartar, Boise District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 1). Twenty-one miles northwest of Weiser, ID. Brush, hardwood litter and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

MM115 HWY 20, Southwest Supervisory Area Office, IDL. Twelve miles northeast of Mountain Home, ID. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and wind-driven runs. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Bobcat Lakes, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 3) mobilizing. Twelve miles east of Wisdom, MT. Timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, group torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Skillet, Flathead NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 7). Fifteen miles west of Olney, MT. Timber and heavy slash. Active fire behavior with group torching, spotting and creeping. Railroad infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Moose, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. Twenty-four miles southwest of Philipsburg, MT. Timber and heavy slash. Moderate fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching and short-range spotting. Residences threatened. Evacuations, road and trail closures in effect.

Upper Smith, Idaho Panhandle NF, USFS. Six miles west of Porthill, ID. Timber, medium slash and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, torching and short crown runs. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Ant Park, Helena-Lewis and Clark NF, USFS. Fifteen miles northeast of White Sulphur Springs, MT. Closed timber litter, timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and single tree torching. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened.

Black Bear, Bitterroot NF, USFS. Fifteen miles east of Hamilton, MT. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Structures threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

North Fork Lost Horse, Bitterroot NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Darby, MT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Road and trail closures in effect.

Silvertip, Flathead NF, USFS. Thirty miles northeast of Condon, MT. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Structures threatened. Trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Breezy conditions persist in the Cascade gaps, the northern Great Basin, and portions of the central/northern Rockies, with gusts up to 30 mph, though winds are lighter than Saturday in eastern Washington and much of eastern Oregon. Isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms will pose a risk for new ignitions from the eastern Sierra through the central Great Basin to the West Slope due to hot temperatures (95-102°F) and low RH (5-15%). Similarly, isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms are forecast in the southern Great Basin to northern Arizona, though higher RH minima (10-25%) will help to reduce overall ignition efficiency. Wetter storms will be scattered near and south of the Mogollon Rim into southeast California, while mostly isolated mixed wet/dry storms occur in and near the higher terrain of Colorado and New Mexico. A particularly active area of thunderstorms may set up across the northern Plains to the western Great Lakes. Thunderstorms will continue along the northern Gulf Coast, the Southeast, and Florida, but will be more isolated along the Lower Mississippi River Valley. Maximum temperatures will be at or above 100°F in the southern Plains for the sixth consecutive day. Warm, dry conditions in eastern Alaska, with elevated fire potential in the Upper Tanana Valley. Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands continue to experience hot, dry, and breezy conditions.
