Three 15-member incident management teams and 196 fireline management personnel from Australia and New Zealand are assigned to support large fires in the Northwest and Great Basin geographic areas.

One Large Airtanker and one Birddog from Manitoba, Canada have been deployed to Boise, ID in support of wildland fire operations.

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Air Force Reserve, CO) have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR. Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers from the 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) and respective support personnel have been deployed to Redding, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Two hundred forty soldiers from the 1st Battalion, 23rd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division based out of Joint Base Lewis McChord (JBLM) are deployed in support of wildland fire operations on the Modrite fire. An Incident Management Organization (IMO) is assigned to support the military contingent.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and group torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Austin incident. Ten miles east of Government Park, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and wind-driven runs. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and uphill runs. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NR Team 6). CIMT (SA Team 3) mobilizing. CIMT is also managing the Hagen incident. Eighteen miles east of Milton-Freewater, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and smoldering. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Grand Park 2 incident. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and isolated torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grand Park 2, Mount Rainier National Park, NPS. Seven miles southwest of Snoquera, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Picture Rock**, Lakeview District, BLM. Three miles north of Summer Lake, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Extreme fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Energy infrastructure threatened.

Wrights Spring, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). Two miles west of Sprague River, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with uphill runs, isolated torching and spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (Cal Fire Team 5). One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Timber, brush and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (2 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (ODF Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Fielder Mtn, Grants Pass Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 1). One mile west of Rogue River, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened.

Big Grass, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 10). Twenty-five miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NW Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Modrite incident. One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Area and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Bologna, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (ODF Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Little Bear, Rosenbaum and Cottonwood incidents. Seven miles northeast of Kimberly, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Little Bear, John Day Unit, Oregon DOF. Eight miles northeast of Mt. Vernon, OR. Timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Rosenbaum, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Ten miles northwest of Spray, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

Cottonwood, John Day Unit, Oregon DOF. Fifteen miles southwest of Long Creek, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Ptarmigan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Transfer of command from NIMO (Team 3) back to the local unit will occur today. Twenty miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber, heavy slash and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

0587 Shingle, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Fourteen miles southeast of Mitchell, OR. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. Five miles south of Post, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

High Lava, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Stabler, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Luna, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Ten miles north of Newhalem, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and spotting. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Border 2, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Thirty-six miles northeast of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Castle, Umpqua NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles northeast of Tiller, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Strong high pressure will deliver another very hot day across the Southern Plains and southeast US with high temperatures in the mid 90s to lower 100s. The heat will combine with minimum RHs in the mid-teens to mid 20s for much of Texas, southern Oklahoma, and a small portion of southern Arkansas and northern Louisiana resulting in a high risk burn environment. Scattered thunderstorms are also expected to develop around the periphery of the ridge including portions of Oklahoma, Arkansas, and much of the southeast US. Across the western half of the US, subtle warming will ensue, especially across the Pacific Northwest, while a weak upper-level disturbance tracks through northern California during the afternoon. This feature will bring gusty winds and low relative humidity values over northeast California, northern Nevada, southeast Oregon, into southern Idaho. This disturbance could also trigger some thunderstorms, especially over eastern Idaho into western Montana. Finally, Tropical Storm Lala will move west of the Hawaiian Islands bringing much lighter winds and a gradual end to the heavy precipitation.
