Three 15-member incident management teams and 196 fireline management personnel from Australia and New Zealand are assigned to support large fires in the Northwest and Great Basin geographic areas.

One Large Airtanker and one Birddog from Manitoba, Canada have been deployed to Boise, ID in support of wildland fire operations.

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Air Force Reserve, CO) have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR. Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers from the 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) and respective support personnel have been deployed to Redding, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Two hundred forty soldiers from the 1st Battalion, 23rd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division based out of Joint Base Lewis McChord (JBLM) are deployed in support of wildland fire operations on the Modrite fire. An Incident Management Organization (IMO) is assigned to support the military contingent.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and group torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Austin and The Narrows incidents. Fourteen miles southwest of Dufur, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and single tree torching. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, flanking and isolated torching. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

*** The Narrows**, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fifteen miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with running, short-range spotting and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NR Team 6) to CIMT (SA Team 3) will occur tomorrow. CIMT is also managing the Hagen incident. Eighteen miles east of Milton-Freewater, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Grand Park 2 incident. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grand Park 2, Mount Rainier National Park, NPS. Seven miles southwest of Snoquera, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wrights Spring, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). Two miles west of Sprague River, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with uphill runs, isolated torching and spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Big Grass, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 10). Twenty-five miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with creeping, torching and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

Fielder Mtn, Grants Pass Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 1). One mile west of Rogue River, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Critical infrastructure threatened.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (Cal Fire Team 5). CIMT is also managing the Reevas Basin incident. One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Timber, brush and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and single tree torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Reevas Basin**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Three miles southeast of Tonasket, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (2 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (ODF Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NW Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Modrite incident. One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering, backing and creeping. Area and road closures in effect.

Bologna, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (ODF Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Little Bear, Rosenbaum and Cottonwood incidents. Seven miles northeast of Kimberly, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Little Bear, John Day Unit, Oregon DOF. Eight miles northeast of Mt. Vernon, OR. Timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Rosenbaum, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Ten miles northwest of Spray, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

Cottonwood, John Day Unit, Oregon DOF. Fifteen miles southwest of Long Creek, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Ptarmigan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Twenty miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber, heavy slash and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

0587 Shingle, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Fourteen miles southeast of Mitchell, OR. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

High Lava, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Stabler, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Luna, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Ten miles north of Newhalem, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and spotting. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Border 2, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Thirty-six miles northeast of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Second Flat, Burns District, BLM. Six miles northeast of Riley, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. Five miles south of Post, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Castle, Umpqua NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles northeast of Tiller, OR. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Picture Rock, Lakeview District, BLM. Three miles north of Summer Lake, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching, creeping and smoldering. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Closed timber litter, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Persistent very hot conditions are expected across southeast and south-central portions of the US where high temperatures will surge into the upper 90s to mid 100s. This will coincide with RHs in the teens and afternoon wind gusts of 20-30 mph resulting in high-risk triggers for significant fire. Hot, unstable, and potentially breezy conditions from thunderstorms could also develop over the lower Mississippi Valley. Over the western US, the main concern will revolve around very warm, dry and breezy conditions forming in the afternoon and evening across portions of the Great Basin, northeast California and the Cascade gaps in eastern Oregon and Washington. The latter locations will see wind gusts of 30-40 mph with RH values in the teens during the afternoon and early evening resulting elevated fire weather concerns. Over Alaska, most of the state will become cooler and wetter except for the Tanana Valley where precipitation isn't expected at this time. Elsewhere in the US, the main feature will be very hot temperatures over the Desert Southwest and a strong cold front sweeping southward from the northern Plains. The front will deliver cooling temperatures and scattered thunderstorms across the Upper Midwest to the western Great Lakes.
