Three 15-member incident management teams and 196 fireline management personnel from Australia and New Zealand are assigned to support large fires in the Northwest and Great Basin geographic areas.

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Air Force Reserve, CO) and one from the 152nd Airlift Wing (NV Air National Guard), with respective support personnel, have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR. Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) have been deployed to Redding, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Two hundred forty soldiers from the 1st Battalion, 23rd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division based out of Joint Base Lewis McChord (JBLM) are deployed in support of wildland fire operations on the Modrite fire. An Incident Management Organization (IMO) is assigned to support the military contingent.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and group torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Austin and The Narrows incidents. Fourteen miles southwest of Dufur, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and single tree torching. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, uphill runs and isolated torching. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

The Narrows, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fifteen miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, short-range spotting and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NR Team 6) to CIMT (SA Team 3) will occur today. CIMT is also managing the Hagen incident. Eighteen miles east of Milton-Freewater, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Grand Park 2 incident. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grand Park 2, Mount Rainier National Park, NPS. Seven miles southwest of Snoquera, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wrights Spring, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 8). CIMT (NW Team 7) mobilizing. Two miles west of Sprague River, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with uphill runs, isolated torching and spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Big Grass, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 10). Twenty-five miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with creeping, torching and spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

Fielder Mtn, Grants Pass Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 1). One mile west of Rogue River, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Critical infrastructure threatened.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (Cal Fire Team 5). CIMT is also managing the Reeves Basin incident. One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Timber, brush and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and isolated torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Reevas Basin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Three miles southeast of Tonasket, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Rowe Creek Complex (2 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (ODF Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NW Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Modrite incident. One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Area and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Bologna, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (ODF Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Cottonwood, Little Bear and Rosenbaum incidents. Seven miles northeast of Kimberly, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Cottonwood, John Day Unit, Oregon DOF. Fifteen miles southwest of Long Creek, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Little Bear, John Day Unit, Oregon DOF. Eight miles northeast of Mt. Vernon, OR. Timber and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Rosenbaum, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Ten miles northwest of Spray, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Ptarmigan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Twenty miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber, heavy slash and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

High Lava, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Stabler, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Luna, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Ten miles north of Newhalem, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

Border 2, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Thirty-six miles northeast of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. Five miles south of Post, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

0587 Shingle, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Fourteen miles southeast of Mitchell, OR. Grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Second Flat, Burns District, BLM. Six miles northeast of Riley, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Picture Rock, Lakeview District, BLM. Three miles north of Summer Lake, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, creeping and smoldering. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Closed timber litter, timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Communication infrastructure threatened.

Egypt, Malheur NF, USFS. Twelve miles north of Riley, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Anthony, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles north of Baker City, OR. Closed timber litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching and creeping. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Castle, Umpqua NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles northeast of Tiller, OR. Grass and brush. No new information.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Strong high pressure will drift westward into Desert Southwest today resulting in subtle warming and drying across much of the western US. Warmer than normal temperatures are forecast for most of the West highs in the upper 80s and 90s across most of the West with readings in the 100s in the Interior Valley of California and into western Arizona. This will combine with relative humidity values in the single digits and teens. Winds will generally be less than 15 mph. The shifting ridge will also allow a cold front to drop into the Central Plains delivering numerous thunderstorms as well as easing the hot and dry conditions of late, especially across eastern Colorado, Kansas and Missouri. South of the front, across Texas, Oklahoma, and Arkansas the oppressive heat will continue with highs forecast in the 100s and relative humidity values in the teens. South winds gusts of 20 to 25 mph in these areas will result in enhanced fire weather conditions. The other area of concern will lie over southern Florida where scattered thunderstorms over record dry fuels could result in new fire starts and gusty outflow winds.
