Three 15-member incident management teams and 270 fireline management personnel from Australia and New Zealand are assigned to support large fires in the Northwest and Great Basin geographic areas.

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Air Force Reserve, CO) and one from the 152nd Airlift Wing (NV Air National Guard), with respective support personnel, have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR. Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) have been deployed to Redding, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Two hundred forty soldiers from the 1st Battalion, 23rd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division based out of Joint Base Lewis McChord (JBLM) are deployed in support of wildland fire operations on the Little Giant fire. An Incident Management Organization (IMO) is assigned to support the military contingent.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 12) to CIMT (CA Team 5) will occur tomorrow. CIMT is also managing the Sisi incident. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, group torching and spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sisi, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Stehekin, WA. Closed timber litter, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and spotting. Energy infrastructure threatened.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Hagen incident. Eighteen miles east of Milton-Freewater, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, spotting and group torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and spotting. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Grand Park 2 and King incidents. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with group torching, spotting and uphill runs. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grand Park 2, Mount Rainier National Park, NPS. Seven miles southwest of Snoquera, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and grass. Active fire behavior with backing, single tree torching and short-range spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **King**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, spotting and uphill runs. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 2). CIMT (GB Team 4) mobilizing. CIMT is also managing the Austin and The Narrows incidents. Fourteen miles southwest of Dufur, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and group torching. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, uphill runs and isolated torching. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

The Narrows, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fifteen miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (Cal Fire Team 5). One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Timber, brush and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with backing, isolated torching and spotting. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wrights Spring, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). Two miles west of Sprague River, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (2 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (ODF Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Big Grass, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 10). Twenty-five miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with creeping, torching and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NW Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Modrite incident. One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Residences threatened.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering.

Fielder Mtn, Grants Pass Unit, Oregon DOF. One mile west of Rogue River, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Rosenbaum, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Ten miles northwest of Spray, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

High Lava, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Stabler, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Luna, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Ten miles north of Newhalem, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Border 2, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Thirty-six miles northeast of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Ptarmigan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Twenty miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber, heavy slash and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Picture Rock, Lakeview District, BLM. Three miles north of Summer Lake, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened.

0587 Shingle, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Fourteen miles southeast of Mitchell, OR. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Second Flat, Burns District, BLM. Six miles northeast of Riley, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Egypt, Malheur NF, USFS. Twelve miles north of Riley, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Balky Hill, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Five miles east of Twisp, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Bologna, Umatilla NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Kimberly, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Moderate fire behavior with flanking, creeping and group torching. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bobcat Lakes, Beaverhead-Deerlodge NF, USFS. Twelve miles east of Wisdom, MT. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and group torching. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Windmill, Stillwater County. Nine miles north of Reed Point, MT. Brush, timber and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, spotting and group torching. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened.

Deer Creek, Northwestern Land Office, Montana DNRC. Eighteen miles west of Marion, MT. Heavy slash and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking and uphill runs. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Gold Mountain, Grand Mesa, Uncompahgre and Gunnison NF, USFS. Two miles north of Ouray, CO. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

An upper trough will cross the Pacific Northwest, Northern Great Basin, and Northern Rockies today, bringing scattered, fast-moving thunderstorms with little rainfall to parts of the area, as well as breezy west to southwesterly winds. This weather will result in critical conditions across parts of northern and eastern Washington, the northern Idaho Panhandle, eastern Oregon, northeast California, and northwest Nevada. Highs in the low to mid 90's are forecast across the Intermountain West, increasing to 100 to 115 over southeast California and southern Arizona. The hot temperatures will coincide with relative humidity levels of 15 to 25%, lowering to near 10% in the Desert Southwest. Gusty winds are expected in the afternoon throughout the Great Basin and into eastern Washington and Oregon, as well, northeastern California. Farther east, the main weather concern will revolve around the unwavering heat across the Southern Plains. High temperatures in this area will peak in the 90s to 110F with relative humidity values dropping into the mid-teens to mid 20s. Scattered mixed wet/dry thunderstorms are expected to develop in the Greater Four Corners and Great Basin, as well as over the Southern Plains into the Lower Mississippi Valley.
