Two 15-member incident management teams and 212 fireline personnel from Australia and New Zealand are assigned to support large fires in the Northwest and Great Basin geographic areas.

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Air Force Reserve, CO) and one from the 152nd Airlift Wing (NV Air National Guard), with respective support personnel, have been deployed to Klamath Falls, OR. Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) have been deployed to Redding, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Two hundred forty soldiers from the 1st Battalion, 23rd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division based out of Joint Base Lewis McChord (JBLM) are deployed in support of wildland fire operations on the Little Giant fire. An Incident Management Organization (IMO) is assigned to support the military contingent.

On August 23, an incident support crewmember with the U.S. Wildland Fire Service experienced a fatal medical emergency while assigned to the Frijoles incident in New Mexico. The firefighting community expresses its condolences to the family and friends of the deceased.

McCully, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 3). CIMT is also managing the North Pole incident. Previously reported as McCulley. Twenty-two miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and grass. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, spotting and torching. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

North Pole, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Eighteen miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and grass. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 5). CIMT is also managing the Sisi incident. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sisi, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Stehekin, WA. Closed timber litter, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with backing and group torching. Energy infrastructure threatened. Trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Hagen incident. Eighteen miles east of Milton-Freewater, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT (NR Team 2) mobilizing. CIMT is also managing the Grand Park 2, King, Goat and Wonderland incidents. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with group torching, flanking and backing. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grand Park 2, Mount Rainier National Park, NPS. Seven miles southwest of Snoquera, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and grass. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

King, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, closed timber litter and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, spotting and uphill runs. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Goat, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Fifteen miles north of Ronald, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with group torching, flanking and uphill runs. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Wonderland**, Mount Rainier National Park, NPS. Nine miles southeast of Snoquera, WA. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with flanking, group torching and backing. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 4). CIMT is also managing the Grasshopper and The Narrows incidents. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs,

flanking and single tree torching. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fourteen miles southwest of Dufur, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and group torching. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

The Narrows, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fifteen miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and single tree torching. Critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (Cal Fire Team 5). One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, backing and creeping. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wrights Spring, Fremont-Winema NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). Two miles west of Sprague River, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (2 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (ODF Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 2) back to the local unit will occur today. CIMT is also managing the Modrite incident. One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, backing and creeping. Residences threatened.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering.

Colwash, Yakama Agency, BIA. Five miles west of Mabton, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened.

Big Grass, Vale District, BLM. Twenty-five miles southwest of Jordan Valley, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with torching, wind-driven runs and smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and trail closures in effect.

High Lava, Gifford Pinchot NF, USFS. Eleven miles northwest of Stabler, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Luna, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Ten miles north of Newhalem, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Ptarmigan, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Twenty miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber, heavy slash and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Border 2, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Thirty-six miles northeast of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

0587 Shingle, Fossil Unit, Oregon DOF. Fourteen miles southeast of Mitchell, OR. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Egypt, Malheur NF, USFS. Twelve miles north of Riley, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Picture Rock, Lakeview District, BLM. Three miles north of Summer Lake, OR. Grass, brush and timber. No new information.

Fielder Mtn, Grants Pass Unit, Oregon DOF. One mile west of Rogue River, OR. Timber, brush and grass. No new information.

* **Mitchell**, Okefenokee NWR, FWS. Fifteen miles southeast of St George, GA. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with backing.

* **H2**, Florida Forest Service. Six miles northwest of Deem City, FL. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with flanking.

Bison, Osage Agency, BIA. Nine miles south of Elgin, OK. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Main Trail, Wassaw NWR, FWS. Twelve miles southeast of Savannah, GA. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with creeping.

Sugar Creek, Anadarko Agency, BIA. One mile west of Binger, OK. Grass and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened.

2690, Anadarko Agency, BIA. Four miles east of Gracemont, OK. Grass and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Residences threatened.

Jackson HWY 90, Mississippi Forestry Commission. Five miles northeast of Moss Point, MS. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Hancock Texas Flat Road, Mississippi Forestry Commission. Six miles southeast of Picayune, MS. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Lightning activity is expected to trend downward across much of the West as compared to Monday with mainly isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms favoring southwest Montana into central Idaho and northwest Wyoming, as well as the eastern Great Basin into the Southwest. It will also be warmer-than-normal in the West, and extreme heat will dominate in southeast California, central/southern Arizona and parts of New Mexico where lower-elevation highs will approach record values of 100°F to 115°F as the monsoon wanes. Expect locally breezy westerly winds along the eastern slopes of the southern Cascades into southeast Oregon and the Sierra Front with generally light winds elsewhere in the West. A slow-moving moist front backing in from the east will boost wetting thunderstorm coverage for Colorado (east of the Divide) and northeast New Mexico. Ahead of the cold front, abnormally hot conditions, gusty southerly winds, and single-digit to low-double-digit RH persists from Texas into southern Oklahoma and Arkansas. Isolated thunderstorms will be found in the Lower Mississippi Valley with better wetting rain chances in southern Georgia and Florida. Alaska's eastern Interior stays cool and showery, as does much of the Ohio Valley and Northeast, while trade winds weaken in Hawai'i under more stable conditions.
