Aspen Acres, Custer County. CIMT (AK Team 1). Twenty miles southwest of Pueblo, CO. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and torching. Numerous residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Gold Mountain, Grand Mesa, Uncompahgre and Gunnison NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 3). Two miles north of Ouray, CO. Grass, brush and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs and group torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Ferris, San Juan NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 7). Seven miles east of Cahone, CO. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, running and torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Willow, Pike and San Isabel NF, USFS. CIMT (SW Team 4). Six miles west of Leadville, CO. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, group torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Twin Creek, Wind River/Bighorn Basin District, BLM. Sixteen miles southeast of Lander, WY. Brush, timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

West Bridger Creek, Hotsprings County. Nineteen miles southeast of Thermopolis, WY. Grass and brush. No new information. Last narrative report unless new information is received.

Cottonwood, Fishlake NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (GB Team 5) to CIMT (GB Team 4) will occur tomorrow. Five miles east of Beaver, UT. Timber, brush and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wild Goose, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 7). Twelve miles northeast of Fillmore, UT. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing, isolated torching and creeping. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Babylon, Manti-La Sal NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 2). Twenty-five miles southwest of Monticello, UT. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, short crown runs and wind-driven runs. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Pvr**, Boise District, BLM. Fifteen miles south of Boise, ID. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running and flanking. Structures threatened.

Kinky Creek, Bridger-Teton NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles northwest of Cora, WY. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened. Area closures in effect.

Grapevine, Ely District, BLM. Ten miles southeast of Caliente, NV. Timber, brush and chaparral. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Isolated to locally scattered mixed wet and dry thunderstorms will develop across eastern Oregon into the northern and eastern Great Basin and much of the Rockies. With minimum relative humidity falling to 10-25% across much of the Intermountain West, several new ignitions are likely, especially in the northern Great Basin to Greater Four Corners. New and existing fires may also be fanned by outflow wind gusts up to 50 mph. In addition, breezy west to southwest winds in the southern Great Basin and along the east slopes of the Cascades to Sierra Front will create areas of elevated conditions. Isolated mainly wet thunderstorms will develop in the northern Plains, with more widespread showers and thunderstorms from the eastern Dakotas to Upper Michigan. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop in much of the lower Mississippi Valley and Southeast. Above normal temperatures are expected in Alaska, especially for portions of the northern Interior and North Slope which could reach 85°F. Furthermore, scattered thunderstorms will develop across the western Interior, with isolated thunderstorms for the eastern Interior and North Slope.
