Predictive Services Discussion:

Isolated to mixed wet and dry thunderstorms capable of new ignitions will develop in northeast Utah into the West Slope and western Wyoming. Isolated, mainly wet, thunderstorms will develop in southeast Arizona and southwest New Mexico. Breezy west winds 12-22 mph with gusts 25-35 mph amid relative humidity of 5-12% will develop in the southern Great Basin to northwest Arizona creating elevated to locally critical conditions. Locally elevated winds gusting near 30 mph will also develop through the Cascade gaps, Sierra Front, and through the Snake River Plain creating areas of elevated conditions. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop in the Lower to Mid-Mississippi Valley into the Lower Great Lakes, Mid-Atlantic, and Northeast, but drier conditions will begin to develop along the southeast Atlantic coast. Dry conditions will continue in northeast Minnesota with minimum relative humidity falling to near 30%. Above normal temperatures will continue in eastern Interior Alaska with isolated thunderstorms, while cooler conditions move into the western half of the state.
