Ferris, San Juan NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 7). Seven miles east of Cahone, CO. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and spotting. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Gold Mountain, Grand Mesa, Uncompahgre and Gunnison NF, USFS. CIMT (RM Team 3). Two miles north of Ouray, CO. Grass, brush and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with backing and group torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Willow, Pike and San Isabel NF, USFS. CIMT (SW Team 4). Six miles west of Leadville, CO. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, single tree torching and smoldering. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Claremont, Ada County. CIMT (EA Team 1). One mile northeast of Boise, ID. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and isolated torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Cottonwood, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 4). Five miles east of Beaver, UT. Timber, brush and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Babylon, Manti-La Sal NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 2). Twenty-five miles southwest of Monticello, UT. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, short crown runs and wind-driven runs. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Wild Goose, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 7). Twelve miles northeast of Fillmore, UT. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Above normal temperatures will combine with breezy southwest to west winds at 12-22 mph with gusts to 30 mph and afternoon relative humidities of 5-15% to elevate fire weather conditions across the southern and western Great Basin, northern Arizona, northwestern New Mexico, far southwestern Colorado, northeastern California, and much of the Inland Northwest. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms are possible over the Upper Mississippi Valley with areas of showers and storms likely across the central Plains, Mid-Mississippi Valley, and Mid-Atlantic States. More scattered showers and storms are forecast over the southern Great Lakes and the Northeast with lesser storm chances over the Southeast. Hot, dry and windy conditions are expected over the eastern Carolinas and northern Florida elevating fire potential once again. Dry conditions will continue in northeast Minnesota with minimum relative humidity falling to 38-43%. Above normal temperatures will continue in eastern Interior Alaska with isolated thunderstorms, while cooler conditions move into the western half of the state.
