Predictive Services Discussion:

Scattered wet/dry storms are forecast to spread from the Southwest north and west into the southern and western Great Basin as well as southwestern Colorado Monday into Monday night. Scattered storms are also possible over the deserts of California and the Sieras.

Well above normal temperatures will combine with gusty south to southwest winds at 12-22 mph with gusts to 30 mph and afternoon relative humidities of 15-30% to elevate fire weather conditions across the Northern Plains and northern Minnesota. Breezy winds, low RH levels and very warm temperatures are forecast over the Inland Northwest, northern Great Basin and Northern Rockies.

Further to the east, areas of showers and storms will continue to affect the south central and southeastern U.S. Relatively cooler conditions are forecast across the Southeast on Monday afternoon with the exception of southern Florida where warmer temperatures will persist. Mild temperatures will persist across the North Slope and the eastern Interior of Alaska while cooler conditions continue over the western half of the state.
