Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NR Team 2). One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Extreme fire behavior with running, wind-driven runs and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Brewer, Prineville Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Akawa Butte and Pilot incidents. Fifteen miles east of Madras, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Extreme fire behavior with spotting, torching and running. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Akawa Butte, Sisters Unit, Oregon DOF. Thirteen miles northeast of Sisters, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with spotting, running and torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Pilot, Prineville District, BLM. Seven miles northwest of Post, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching, backing and creeping. Residences threatened.

* **Rowe Creek Complex** (6 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 2). Includes the previously reported Cove Creek, Crosswhite, Deep Canyon, Camel Hump and Redrock incidents. Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

* **Hay Creek Complex** (5 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 10). Includes the previously reported Porcupine Ridge, Hopkin, Hoag, and Wilcox incidents. Five miles west of Condon, OR. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, flanking and short-range spotting.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 1). Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, group torching and spotting. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Salmon, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). CIMT is also managing the Olive Butte incident. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and short-range spotting. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Olive Butte, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and short-range spotting. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Anthony, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 3) to CIMT (NW Team 13) will occur tomorrow. Thirty-four miles north of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 1) mobilizing. Sixteen miles southeast of Prineville, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Extreme fire behavior with running and torching. Residences threatened.

Henry, Prineville District, BLM. Five miles south of Paulina Guard Station, OR. Brush, grass and timber. Active fire behavior with running and torching. Residences threatened.

Powder River, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 3) mobilizing. Four miles southwest of Richland, OR. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running, flanking and backing. Numerous structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). CIMT is also managing the Hagen and Horse Ridge incidents. Fifteen miles south of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, spotting and backing.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, backing and flanking. Residences threatened. Evacuations in effect.

Horse Ridge, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Critical infrastructure threatened.

* **Modrite**, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NR Team 3) mobilizing. Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, torching and spotting. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Royal Lake, Mid Columbia NWR, FWS. Eight miles northwest of Othello, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Lyons Ferry, Washington State Fire Marshal's Office. Sixteen miles east of Kahlotus, WA. Grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, uphill runs and running. Numerous structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Devils Canyon, Washington State Fire Marshal's Office. Four miles south of Kahlotus, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

Neff Jones, Washington State Fire Marshal's Office. Seventeen miles south of Kahlotus, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

Bologna, Umatilla NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Kimberly, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, flanking and single tree torching. Structures threatened.

* **Burnt Creek**, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles north of Enterprise, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Residences threatened.

Wallace Walker, Washington State Fire Marshal's Office. Five miles southwest of Kahlotus, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Road and trail closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Egypt, Malheur NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 2) mobilizing. Fifteen miles north of Riley, OR. Timber. No new information.

Riddle, Burns District, BLM. Twelve miles east of Diamond, OR. Grass and timber. No new information. Last narrative report unless new information is received.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Extreme heat will spread across the Northern Plains today, where high temperatures will reach 10–20 °F above normal and relative humidity will fall as low as 15–20%. Strong west winds are also forecast across the Northern Plains and much of the Northern Rockies Geographic Area as an upper-level trough moves through southern Saskatchewan. Hot, dry, and breezy conditions will continue across the Inland Northwest and most of California, except the far southeastern portion of the state, where monsoonal moisture will bring another round of showers and thunderstorms. The monsoonal circulation will also produce scattered showers and thunderstorms across the Southwest into Utah and eastern Nevada, where lighter precipitation amounts will increase the potential for new fire starts. Across the Northern Great Plains and Great Lakes, southerly winds will prevail through much of the day before shifting westerly this evening and overnight with the arrival of thunderstorms.
