Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NR Team 2). One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Extreme fire behavior with running, wind-driven runs and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Powder River, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 3). Four miles southwest of Richland, OR. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, running and flanking. Numerous structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

Akawa Butte, Sisters Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 2). Thirteen miles northeast of Sisters, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with spotting, torching and uphill runs. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 1). Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, spotting and flanking. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). CIMT is also managing the Hagen and Horse Ridge incidents. Fifteen miles south of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and spotting. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Horse Ridge, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and backing. Critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Salmon, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). CIMT is also managing the Olive Butte incident. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and single tree torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Olive Butte, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Anthony, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 3) to CIMT (NW Team 13) will occur today. Thirty-four miles north of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Royal Lake, Mid Columbia NWR, FWS. Eight miles northwest of Othello, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Scattered showers and a mix of wet and dry thunderstorms will spread across the Southwest and Four Corners, with the greatest coverage over Utah and the central Great Basin. Heavy rainfall and flash flooding are possible across much of Arizona and southwestern New Mexico. Monsoonal moisture will expand westward into western Nevada and the Sierra Nevada, where drier thunderstorms and gusty outflow winds are more likely. Isolated thunderstorms are also possible across northeastern California and southern Oregon.

Hot, dry conditions will persist across the Pacific Northwest and Great Plains, where relative humidity will fall to 10–15% and temperatures will remain well above normal. Winds across Central North and South Dakota are likely to gust up to 40 mph. Breezy northwest winds will continue from the northern Plains into the Great Lakes, accompanied by thunderstorms, some of which may become severe.

Across the Southeast, widespread rainfall will continue along Florida's Gulf Coast, with scattered showers and thunderstorms elsewhere across the region. Far southern Florida will remain comparatively dry and breezy, while deep south Texas continues a dry pattern with little or no rainfall expected.
