Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NR Team 3). Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, torching and spotting. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Burnt Creek, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles north of Enterprise, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and torching. Residences threatened.

Anthony, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). Thirty-four miles north of Baker City, OR. Timber and closed timber litter. Active fire behavior with backing and group torching. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NR Team 2). One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking and isolated torching. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Akawa Butte, Sisters Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 2). Thirteen miles northeast of Sisters, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with group torching, spotting and uphill runs. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

0512 Box Springs, Prineville Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Brewer incident. Eighteen miles west of Mitchell, OR. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Communication infrastructure threatened.

Brewer, Prineville Unit, Oregon DOF. Fifteen miles east of Madras, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hay Creek Complex (6 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 10). Five miles west of Condon, OR. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching.

Powder River, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 3). Four miles southwest of Richland, OR. Timber, grass and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (5 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, torching and backing. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). CIMT is also managing the Hagen and Horse Ridge incidents. Fifteen miles south of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Horse Ridge, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 1). Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Closed timber litter, timber and medium slash. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, spotting and flanking. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 1). CIMT is also managing the Henry and 0496 Crooked incidents. Five miles south of Post, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Henry, Prineville District, BLM. Five miles south of Paulina Guard Station, OR. Brush, grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

0496 Crooked, Prineville District, BLM. Twenty-three miles southeast of Post, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Salmon, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). CIMT is also managing the Olive Butte incident. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and single tree torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Olive Butte, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and spotting. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Lyons Ferry, Washington State Fire Marshal's Office. Sixteen miles east of Kahlotus, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, flanking and backing. Road and trail closures in effect.

Bologna, Umatilla NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Kimberly, OR. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened.

*** 518 Sully**, Prineville District, BLM. Eight miles west of Boardman, OR. Grass. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened.

Royal Lake, Mid Columbia NWR, FWS. Eight miles northwest of Othello, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Neff Jones, Washington State Fire Marshal's Office. Seventeen miles south of Kahlotus, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior. Road and trail closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Egypt, Malheur NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Stone Creek incident. Twelve miles north of Riley, OR. Timber and brush. No new information.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Scattered showers and a mix of wet and dry thunderstorms will spread across the Southwest and Great Basin, extending north into the central Idaho Mountains. Heavy rainfall and flash flooding are possible across much of Arizona, western New Mexico, Utah, and eastern Nevada. Farther west, isolated thunderstorms, some capable of producing little rainfall, are possible across the southern Cascades, while hot, dry conditions persist from the northern Cascades through the Northern Rockies and Great Plains.

A cold front moving across the Northeast will support widespread thunderstorms and localized flash flooding from the Upper Midwest to the Mid-Atlantic. Behind the front, strong northerly winds will develop across Minnesota and the Upper Great Lakes. Meanwhile, a tropical depression over the Gulf of America will continue to supply deep moisture and energy for heavy rainfall along the eastern Gulf Coast and southern Atlantic states. Strong winds are also expected across South Florida and the Carolina coast, where limited rainfall may contribute to elevated fire potential.
