Akawa Butte, Sisters Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 2). Thirteen miles northeast of Sisters, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with torching, running and spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). CIMT is also managing the Hagen and Horse Ridge incidents. Fifteen miles south of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Horse Ridge, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NR Team 2). One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NR Team 3). Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and group torching. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

0512 Box Springs, Prineville Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Brewer incident. Eighteen miles west of Mitchell, OR. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Brewer, Prineville Unit, Oregon DOF. Fifteen miles east of Madras, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (5 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, flanking and torching. Communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hay Creek Complex (5 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 10). Five miles west of Condon, OR. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Area closures in effect.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 1). CIMT (FL State Team 1) mobilizing. Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Closed timber litter, timber and medium slash. Moderate fire behavior with short crown runs, spotting and backing. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Powder River, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 3). Four miles southwest of Richland, OR. Timber, grass and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, torching and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Anthony, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Burnt Creek incident. Thirty-four miles north of Baker City, OR. Closed timber litter and timber. Active fire behavior with isolated torching, backing and creeping. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Burnt Creek, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles north of Enterprise, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with running, spotting and torching. Residences threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Salmon, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). CIMT is also managing the Olive Butte incident. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and single tree torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Olive Butte, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 1). CIMT is also managing the Henry and 0496 Crooked incidents. Five miles south of Post, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Henry, Prineville District, BLM. Five miles south of Paulina Guard Station, OR. Brush, grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

0496 Crooked, Prineville District, BLM. Twenty-three miles southeast of Post, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Egypt, Malheur NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Stone Creek incident. Twelve miles north of Riley, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and isolated torching. Road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Stone Creek, Malheur NF, USFS. Previously reported incident. Ten miles south of Suplee, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and isolated torching. Structures threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with single tree torching, backing and flanking. Road and trail closures in effect.

*** Cow Camp Complex (2 fires)**, Vale District, BLM. Twenty-five miles northwest of Vale, OR. Grass and brush. Extreme fire behavior with running, uphill runs and backing. Residences threatened. Road closures in effect.

Bologna, Umatilla NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Kimberly, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and group torching. Structures threatened. Area closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Scattered showers and wet thunderstorms will continue across the Southwest and eastern Great Basin into much of Colorado, Wyoming, and western Montana. Heavy rainfall and possible flash flooding are possible across portions of the central Rockies. Farther west, isolated thunderstorms, including a mix of wet and dry storms capable of producing gusty outflow winds, are possible this afternoon along the Cascades, east of the Cascades in Oregon and southern Washington, and along the Sierra Nevada. As an offshore low deepens, southwest winds will strengthen across California and the broader Northwest, while very hot and dry conditions persist across much of southern California, the Inland Northwest, Northern Rockies and southern Great Plains, while the Great Lakes and far Northeast experience seasonably mild conditions.

A cold front will bring widespread rain to much of the Atlantic Coast, except from the Carolina coast through Florida, with severe thunderstorms possible across portions of the Mid-Atlantic. Meanwhile, Tropical Storm Bertha will continue westward across the Gulf of America, bringing wetting rainfall to the Texas and Louisiana coasts while producing strong winds across portions of the southeastern United States.
