Akawa Butte, Sisters Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 2). Thirteen miles northeast of Sisters, OR. Timber, brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with torching, running and spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). CIMT is also managing the Hagen and Horse Ridge incidents. Fifteen miles south of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Active fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Horse Ridge, Umatilla NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kaiser Canyon, Colville Agency, BIA. CIMT (NR Team 2). One mile south of Nespelem, WA. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with flanking, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Brewer, Prineville Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 3). CIMT is also managing the 0512 Box Springs incident. Fifteen miles east of Madras, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, group torching and spotting. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

0512 Box Springs, Prineville Unit, Oregon DOF. Eighteen miles west of Mitchell, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, spotting and group torching. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Anthony, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Burnt Creek incident. Thirty-four miles north of Baker City, OR. Closed timber litter and timber. Active fire behavior with isolated torching, backing and creeping. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Burnt Creek, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Twenty-three miles north of Enterprise, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with spotting, single tree torching and running. Residences threatened.

Modrite, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. CIMT (NR Team 3). Seventeen miles southwest of Inchelium, WA. Timber and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking and group torching. Road closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex (3 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 2). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, timber and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, torching and spotting. Communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hay Creek Complex (3 fires), Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (NW Team 10). Five miles west of Condon, OR. Grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Area closures in effect.

E Evans Creek Rd, Medford Unit, Oregon DOF. CIMT (ODF Team 1). CIMT (FL State Team 1) mobilizing. Fourteen miles northeast of Rogue River, OR. Closed timber litter, timber and medium slash. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching, smoldering and backing. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Powder River, Vale District, BLM. CIMT (SW Team 3). Four miles southwest of Richland, OR. Grass, hardwood litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with uphill runs, isolated torching and short-range spotting. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

Salmon, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 12). CIMT is also managing the Olive Butte incident. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and single tree torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Olive Butte, Wallowa-Whitman NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles southwest of Baker City, OR. Timber and light slash. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and isolated torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Coyote, Ochoco NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 1). CIMT is also managing the Henry incident. Five miles south of Post, OR. Brush, timber and medium slash. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, backing and flanking. Numerous structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Henry, Prineville District, BLM. Five miles south of Paulina Guard Station, OR. Brush, grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and flanking. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Egypt, Malheur NF, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Stone Creek incident. Twelve miles north of Riley, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and isolated torching. Road closures in effect.

Stone Creek, Malheur NF, USFS. Ten miles south of Suplee, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and isolated torching. Structures threatened.

Cow Camp Complex (2 fires), Vale District, BLM. Twenty-five miles northwest of Vale, OR. Grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering.

* **Ptarmigan**, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Twenty-five miles northwest of Mazama, WA. Timber. Active fire behavior with crowning, running and uphill runs. Structures threatened. Trail closures in effect.

Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with short crown runs, backing and flanking. Structures threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

Bologna, Umatilla NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Kimberly, OR. Timber and grass. Active fire behavior with flanking, backing and single tree torching. Structures threatened. Area closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Isolated to scattered wet and dry thunderstorms will develop across Washington and the Northern Rockies today as gusty west to southwest winds strengthen behind the activity over northern California and much of Oregon. Relative humidity will fall to 10–15% across the western Great Basin, southwestern Idaho, and southern Oregon, where temperatures will reach 5–10°F above normal, exceeding 100°F at lower elevations. Extreme heat will also expand across southern California and eastern Arizona as monsoonal thunderstorms shift eastward into the Four Corners, central Rockies, and Great Plains, where heavy rainfall and flash flooding are possible across eastern Colorado and northeastern Kansas.

Hot and dry conditions will also prevail from the Northern Plains into the Great Lakes and across much of Texas and the southern Plains, except along the southeast Texas coast, where Tropical Storm Bertha is expected to make landfall this afternoon with sustained winds of 40–55 mph, heavy rain, and thunderstorms, while its moisture continues to support heavy rain and possible flash flooding across portions of the southern Mid-Atlantic, Carolinas, and Tennessee Valley. Farther east, hot, dry, and breezy conditions will persist across portions of the far southeastern United States.
