## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Above normal temperatures will continue in Minnesota today, with temperatures returning to above normal in Michigan. Low relative humidity from 18-30% will continue from the Arrowhead into the northern Lower Peninsula, and locally breezy east winds 10-15 mph in central Lower Michigan will create areas of elevated conditions. In the Southwest, dry conditions will persist as well, with westerly winds 10-15 mph amid minimum relative humidity of 5-12% and poor overnight recovery for mid-slopes and ridges. An upper-level low will slowly move across the Canadian Prairies, with wetting precipitation continuing for portions of northwest and north-central Montana. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue in much of the Southeast, while very dry conditions continue in the Mid-Atlantic with minimum relative humidity of 20-30%. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms are also expected to develop across much of the High Plains. A warming and drying trend will begin across Alaska with temperatures closer to normal today, although areas of rain are expected for portions of the central Interior.
