Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Above normal temperatures and low relative humidity will persist across the Upper Great Lakes today, but winds will be lighter today and generally less than 10 mph. Above normal temperatures will continue in the Southwest and southern Great Basin, with low relative humidity of 5-15% continuing in the southern Great Basin and Arizona. A backdoor cold front will push moisture western toward the Divide in the Southwest, with isolated to scattered mixed wet and dry thunderstorms near the Divide. Farther east across the eastern half of New Mexico to the southern High Plains, more widespread wet thunderstorms are expected with locally heavy rainfall. Temperatures 10-20°F are expected in California and the coastal Northwest today, while drier conditions are expected in Montana. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue in much of the Southeast. A warming trend is expected in much of Alaska today with temperatures rising a few degrees above normal while relative humidity falls to 20-30% across much of the Interior.
