Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Above normal temperatures will persist across the Upper Great Lakes today, with increasing winds expected across northern Minnesota with south winds 10-20 mph gusting 20-30 mph amid minimum relative humidity 20-30% creating locally elevated conditions. Winds will be lighter in Michigan, but minimum relative humidity will be lower at 15-25%. Above normal temperatures will continue in Arizona and the Great Basin, with low relative humidity of 5-15% continuing in the southern Great Basin and Arizona. Isolated dry thunderstorms are possible in eastern Arizona into far western New Mexico, but thunderstorms will become wetter and increase in coverage near and east of the Divide into the southern High Plains. A cold front will move into the Northwest and northern Rockies today with cooler temperatures, but showers will be scattered and light. Scattered thunderstorms will continue in the southern half of Florida, but much drier conditions are expected east of the Appalachians as minimum relative humidity falls to 18-30%. Above normal temperatures are expected much of Alaska today while relative humidity falls to 18-30% across much of the Interior.
