Predictive Services Discussion:

Strong southwest winds 15-30 mph with gusts 30-50 mph amid relative humidity of 5-15% will develop across much of the Great Basin into northern Arizona, and western Colorado today creating widespread to elevated conditions. Breezy south winds 10-20 mph and gusts to 35 mph will develop across portions of Wyoming and the Nebraska Panhandle today for elevated conditions there, as well. Isolated dry thunderstorms are expected to develop near and ahead of the cold front from east-central Nevada into northern Utah late this afternoon and tonight, while isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms develop in south-central Colorado to the New Mexico central mountains. Breezy west winds will continue in California and the Northwest, but temperatures will be cooler and humidity higher. Very dry conditions will continue in eastern North Carolina and Virginia as relative humidity falls as low as 20%, with dry conditions northward into New Jersey, as well. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop along a cold front moving through the Ohio Valley to the northeast, with isolated showers and thunderstorms along a cold front in eastern Montana. Temperatures will remain above normal across the southern half of Alaska today with relative humidity as low as 25%, before cooler wetter weather moves in early next week.
