* **Iron**, Central Area, Utah DOF. CIMT (GB Team 3) mobilizing. Two miles northwest of Eureka, UT. Chaparral and grass. Extreme fire behavior with running, spotting and torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Road closures in effect.

Grapevine, Ely District, BLM. Ten miles southeast of Caliente, NV. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, torching and short-range spotting.

Sawmill, Color Country Paria Unit, BLM. Forty-four miles northwest of Cedar City, UT. Dormant brush and grass. Extreme fire behavior with running, torching and spotting. Structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Kane Springs, Ely District, BLM. Seventeen miles southwest of Caliente, NV. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, isolated torching and flanking. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Rock Canyon, Northern District, Arizona DOF. Twenty miles southeast of Fredonia, AZ. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with single tree torching, creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Dellenbaugh, Lake Mead National Recreation Area, NPS. Eighty miles south of St. George, UT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Residences threatened.

* **Shyster**, Winnemucca District, BLM. Fifteen miles south of Denio, NV. Brush and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, backing and flanking. Energy infrastructure threatened.

* **Hastings**, West Desert District, BLM. Fifty-six miles west of Salt Lake City, UT. Chaparral. Extreme fire behavior with running and torching. Structures threatened.

* **Mary**, Boise District, BLM. Sixty miles south of Mountain Home, ID. Grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with running, flanking and backing. Structures threatened.

* **Middlefork**, Northwest Area, Utah DOF. Thirty-eight miles northeast of Salt Lake City, UT. Brush. Active fire behavior with running and smoldering.

* **Deer Canyon**, Bernalillo District, NM State Forestry. Four miles south of Mountainair, NM. Grass. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, short crown runs and short-range spotting. Residences threatened.

Rio, Santa Fe NF, USFS. Fifteen miles east of Espanola, NM. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with isolated torching, backing and creeping.

Bear, Gila NF, USFS. Eighteen miles southeast of Quemado, NM. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Hot and unstable conditions, along with widespread single digit relative humidity this afternoon will result in a critical burn environment across much of Arizona, New Mexico and far southern Utah. Winds will ease a bit from the last few days, but westerly gusts of 20-30 mph will be common. Very hot, dry and breezy conditions will expand into the Southern Plains, where fuels are not as receptive as farther west. Drier weather will return to the northern Intermountain West, and lightning holdovers could continue to emerge as relative humidity falls into the 10-20% range. Breezy conditions in the Snake River Plain will lead to locally elevated fire weather there. Widespread thunderstorms are in store for the Alaska Interior, likely resulting in abundant new ignitions, along with the potential for erratic outflow winds. Temperatures will remain very warm throughout the Interior ahead of any rainfall. Severe thunderstorms and flooding rain will target the Midwest, while the Gulf Coast may see localized flooding from scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Thunderstorm coverage will be lower over the Florida peninsula, and new lightning ignitions will be possible where rainfall has been lighter recently.
