Iron, Central Area, Utah DOF. CIMT (GB Team 3). One mile northwest of Eureka, UT. Chaparral and grass. Extreme fire behavior with short crown runs, uphill runs and wind-driven runs. Numerous structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

* **Bonneville**, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. Three miles east of Salt Lake City, UT. Grass, brush and hardwood litter. Active fire behavior with running, backing and creeping. Numerous residences threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

Sawmill, Color Country Paria Unit, BLM. Forty-four miles northwest of Cedar City, UT. Dormant brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and isolated torching. Structures threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Hastings, West Desert District, BLM. Fifty-six miles west of Salt Lake City, UT. Chaparral. Extreme fire behavior. Structures threatened.

Grapevine, Ely District, BLM. Ten miles southeast of Caliente, NV. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with running, spotting and torching.

Middlefork, Bear River Area, Utah DOF. Thirty-eight miles northeast of Salt Lake City, UT. Brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Kane Springs, Ely District, BLM. Seventeen miles southwest of Caliente, NV. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, group torching and spotting. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Rock Canyon, Northern District, Arizona DOF. Twenty miles southeast of Fredonia, AZ. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with single tree torching, creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Shyster, Winnemucca District, BLM. Previously reported as 020281. Fifteen miles south of Denio, NV. Brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Mary, Boise District, BLM. Sixty miles south of Mountain Home, ID. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Dellenbaugh, Lake Mead National Recreation Area, NPS. Eighty miles south of St. George, UT. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Residences threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A high pressure ridge aloft will rebuild across the West today, bringing a warming and drying trend to the region. Relative humidity throughout the southern Intermountain West will fall into the single digits, and combined with breezy southwesterly winds, elevated to locally critical fire weather is likely. Lightning holdovers could emerge across portions of the northern Intermountain West that saw thunderstorms Friday into Saturday. Relative humidity will fall to as low as 10-20% away from the immediate cooling influence of the Pacific, with areas of single digit relative humidity possible across southeast Oregon into southern Idaho. Westerly wind gusts up to 30 mph will bring elevated fire weather to the Snake River Plain. Drought impacts, high temperatures well into the 90s and breezy conditions will lead to increasing fire risks in the Carolinas, while scattered thunderstorms may bring new ignitions and gusty outflow winds to the Florida peninsula. Alaska will continue to see scattered showers and thunderstorms, with new lightning ignitions most likely in the central and eastern Interior.
