**Iron**, Central Area, Utah DOF. CIMT (GB Team 3). One mile northwest of Eureka, UT. Chaparral and grass. Extreme fire behavior with uphill runs, spotting and short crown runs. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect.

**Hastings**, West Desert District, BLM. Thirty-five miles northwest of Dugway, UT. Chaparral. Active fire behavior with running and torching.

**Grapevine**, Ely District, BLM. Ten miles southeast of Caliente, NV. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with running, crowning and group torching.

**Kane Springs**, Ely District, BLM. Seventeen miles southwest of Caliente, NV. Grass, brush and timber. Extreme fire behavior with uphill runs, backing and torching.

**Bonneville**, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. Three miles east of Salt Lake City, UT. Grass, brush and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Numerous residences threatened. Road and trail closures in effect.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Hot and dry weather will dominate much of the West today as a high pressure ridge aloft peaks in intensity. High temperature records may be set across southern Colorado into New Mexico. A gradual escalation in fire activity is anticipated throughout the West as lightning holdovers continue to emerge amid accelerated drying of the landscape. Look for relative humidity from 10-15% across most of the Intermountain West, with single digits expected across the southern Great Basin, West Slope and portions of the Southwest into southern California. Southwesterly breezes will increase across southern Nevada and Utah into northern Arizona, potentially resulting in a more active day for fires established there. A disturbance and its associated moisture could begin to trigger isolated dry thunderstorms across the Lower Colorado River Valley tonight. Alaska will continue to see scattered thunderstorms over the central and eastern Interior, while moisture and rainfall will increase farther south. The Yukon Flats will remain warm and dry, however. The Florida peninsula will see another day of near-record heat and limited thunderstorm activity, while hot, dry and breezy conditions lead to elevated fire risks across the Carolinas.
