Cottonwood, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 5). Five miles east of Beaver, UT. Timber and chaparral. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, crowning and long-range spotting. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

Iron, Central Area, Utah DOF. CIMT (GB Team 3). One mile northwest of Eureka, UT. Grass, brush and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs and group torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Road closures in effect.

Hastings, West Desert District, BLM. Thirty-five miles northwest of Dugway, UT. Chaparral. Moderate fire behavior with torching, uphill runs and smoldering.

Grapevine, Ely District, BLM. Ten miles southeast of Caliente, NV. Timber and brush. Active fire behavior with torching, flanking and wind-driven runs.

Kane Springs, Ely District, BLM. Seventeen miles southwest of Caliente, NV. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering, creeping and backing. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

* **Kinky Creek**, Bridger-Teton NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles northwest of Cora, WY. Timber. Active fire behavior with uphill runs and short-range spotting. Residences threatened.

Sawmill, Color Country Paria Unit, BLM. Forty-four miles northwest of Cedar City, UT. Dormant brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened. Road closures in effect.

Rock Canyon, Northern District, Arizona DOF. Twenty miles southeast of Fredonia, AZ. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Bonneville, Uinta-Wasatch-Cache NF, USFS. Three miles east of Salt Lake City, UT. Grass, brush and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Road and trail closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Sycamore, Tonto NF, USFS. Fifteen miles north of Globe, AZ. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, wind-driven runs and single tree torching. Structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

An increase in sunshine and instability today will allow for more numerous thunderstorms to develop across the greater Four Corners and northern Rockies, with a mix of wet and dry thunderstorms west of the Divide and wetter storms to the east. Lightning-ignited fires will be most likely across northern Arizona and New Mexico into southern and eastern Utah, southern and western Colorado and far southern Wyoming. Gusty and erratic outflow winds will accompany this activity. Much drier air will begin to return farther west, extending from southern California through the western Great Basin and interior Northwest. Elevated fire weather with relative humidity below 15% and gusty west to southwest winds could allow for lightning holdovers to emerge. The strongest gusts will occur through the Cascade gaps as cooler air begins to arrive in the Northwest late. Alaska will continue to see warm temperatures and scattered thunderstorms over the western and northern Interior, while overall drier conditions persist farther to the south. Lightning holdovers could emerge there, and across the Southeast from Florida to the coastal Carolinas.
