## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

A strong, but dry, cold front will move south over the central and southern Plains today. Breezy westerly winds ahead of the front busting to 35 mph will become northerly 20-30 mph with gusts to 50 mph behind the front. Minimum relative humidity will fall to 8-20% behind the front, and increase slightly to 20-30% behind the front creating widespread elevated to critical conditions. Breezy westerly winds will develop across portions of southwest Wyoming, the West Slope, and western New Mexico creating elevated to locally critical conditions. Furthermore, isolated dry thunderstorms are possible along the Front Range into western Kansas this afternoon providing a source of new ignitions. Hot, record-setting temperatures will continue west of the Divide in the Southwest, but much cooler temperatures are expected across the northern half of the West. A cold front will move through the Lower Great Lakes, Ohio Valley, and Northeast today with areas of wetting rain, and a few severe thunderstorms are expected in Illinois eastward into western Pennsylvania. Breezy and dry westerly winds are also expected ahead of the front across Arkansas eastward into Kentucky and Tennessee creating areas of elevated conditions. Temperatures will continue to gradually warm across Alaska but remain below normal, while dry trade winds are expected across Hawai'i with light windward showers.
