* **Slover Rd**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Four miles southwest of Jesup, GA. Southern rough and timber. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, short-range spotting and group torching. Structures threatened.

* **Carroll - Cr 145**, Mississippi Forestry Commission. Five miles northeast of Black Hawk, MS. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with running and wind-driven runs. Residences threatened.

* **Lamar Bennett Trail**, Georgia Forestry Commission. One mile west of Beach, GA. Southern rough and timber. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, short-range spotting and group torching. Structures threatened.

* **Box**, Osage Agency, BIA. Seven miles south of Gray Horse, OK. Timber, grass and hardwood litter. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, wind-driven runs and long-range spotting. Residences threatened.

* **Blue Skies**, North Carolina Forest Service. Three miles southwest of St. Pauls, NC. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with running. Residences threatened.

Polk Treat Mountain, Georgia Forestry Commission. Two miles south of Esom Hill, GA. Timber and hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened.

Poplar, National Forests in North Carolina, USFS. One mile north of Poplar, NC. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened.

Buffalo Pasture, Oklahoma DOF. Four miles north of Christie, OK. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened.

Shady Grove, Oklahoma DOF. Three miles north of Hulbert, OK. Timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened.

* **Wesley Church**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Twelve miles north of Butler, GA. Timber. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs and uphill runs.

Woodlawn, Francis Marion & Sumter NF, USFS. Six miles north of Evans, SC. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and flanking.

* **Fox Gap**, Great Smoky Mountains National Park, NPS. Eleven miles northwest of Robbinsville, NC. Hardwood litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and backing. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Old Kentucky, Oklahoma DOF. Eleven miles north of Sallisaw, OK. Hardwood litter. Moderate fire behavior.

139, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Bullhead, Francis Marion & Sumter NF, USFS. Seven miles south of Cordesville, SC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with creeping.

Mill Pond, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Tarkiln Ridge, National Forests in North Carolina, USFS. Five miles northwest of Hayesville, NC. Hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior.

Big Toe, Oklahoma DOF. Eight miles northwest of Wilburton, OK. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

* **Heard Redland Road**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land three miles west of Franklin, GA. Timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Coleman Hollow, Oklahoma DOF. Five miles south of Locust Grove, OK. Hardwood litter. No new information.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Breezy westerly winds will develop across the northern Great Basin through Wyoming into the Nebraska panhandle, and southward into Utah, Colorado, and New Mexico. The lowest relative humidity of 8-20% is forecast in Wyoming and the Nebraska panhandle southward to the southern High Plains where elevated to critical conditions will develop. Isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms will also develop across eastern Arizona into New Mexico and the Texas panhandle this afternoon and evening. A weak cold front will move through the Northwest and northern Rockies bringing scattered light precipitation, with snow above 4,000 to 7,000 feet from north to south. A cold front will move through the Great Lakes with showers, thunderstorms, and areas of wetting rain. Isolated thunderstorms will develop across Florida, and while much of the Southeast will remain dry, relative humidity will be much higher than observed over the weekend. Dry conditions will continue across Alaska with temperatures slightly below normal, while trade winds remain elevated across Hawai'i.
