* **Cane Creek**, North Carolina Forest Service. Started on private land nine miles north of North Wilkesboro, NC. Timber. Active fire behavior with running. Structures threatened. Evacuations in effect.

* **Jumping Branch**, North Carolina Forest Service. Started on private land four miles north of Marion, NC. Timber. Active fire behavior with running. Residences threatened.

* **River Ranch**, Oklahoma DOF. Seven miles northeast of Proctor, OK. Timber. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened.

* **Thompson**, Osage Agency, BIA. Five miles southwest of Bowring, OK. Timber, hardwood litter and grass. Extreme fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and spotting.

* **Walnut**, Oklahoma DOF. Three miles north of Albion, OK. Hardwood litter and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs and torching.

* **Middle Toe**, Oklahoma DOF. Seven miles south of Quinton, OK. Grass and timber. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs, running and flanking.

Woodlawn, Francis Marion & Sumter NF, USFS. Six miles north of Evans, SC. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and flanking.

Fox Gap, Great Smoky Mountains National Park, NPS. Eleven miles northwest of Robbinsville, NC. Hardwood litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

139, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Box, Osage Agency, BIA. Seven miles south of Gray Horse, OK. Timber, grass and hardwood litter. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, wind-driven runs and long-range spotting. Residences threatened.

Carroll – Cr 145, Mississippi Forestry Commission. Five miles northeast of Black Hawk, MS. Southern rough. Extreme fire behavior with running and wind-driven runs. Residences threatened.

Lamar Bennett Trail, Georgia Forestry Commission. One mile west of Beach, GA. Southern rough and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened.

Bullhead, Francis Marion & Sumter NF, USFS. Seven miles south of Cordesville, SC. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with creeping.

Mill Pond, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Three miles south of Telogia, FL. Southern rough and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Slover Rd, Georgia Forestry Commission. Four miles southwest of Jesup, GA. Southern rough and timber. Moderate fire behavior with wind-driven runs, creeping and smoldering. Structures and railroad infrastructure threatened. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

* **Hall Thompson Lane**, Alabama Forestry Commission. Nineteen miles north of Westover, AL. Brush. Minimal fire behavior.

Buffalo Pasture, Oklahoma DOF. Four miles north of Christie, OK. Grass and timber. Minimal fire behavior.

Old Kentucky, Oklahoma DOF. Eleven miles north of Sallisaw, OK. Hardwood litter. Minimal fire behavior. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Poplar, National Forests in North Carolina, USFS. One mile north of Poplar, NC. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior. Structures threatened. Trail closures in effect. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Zipperer South, Oklahoma DOF. Six miles southeast of Hartshorne, OK. Hardwood litter and grass. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs and flanking. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

* **Coalport Road**, Kentucky DOF. Two miles southeast of Artemus, KY. Timber and grass. Moderate fire behavior with running, flanking and creeping. Structures threatened. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Shady Grove, Oklahoma DOF. Three miles north of Hulbert, OK. Timber and grass. No new information.

Wesley Church, Georgia Forestry Commission. Twelve miles north of Butler, GA. Timber. No new information.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Breezy southwest winds will develop across the Great Basin, West Slope, and Southwest into the southern High Plains today. However, relative humidity will be higher in the Great Basin and Four Corners with scattered showers mitigating the winds, with elevated to locally critical conditions most likely across eastern New Mexico into West Texas. Isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms will also develop ahead of the dry line in the Texas Panhandle and western Oklahoma. Isolated showers and thunderstorms are expected in the Lower Mississippi Valley, with locally breezy and dry southwest winds expected across the southern Appalachians and Piedmont. Scattered showers are expected across central and northern California into Oregon eastward into the central Rockies. A cold front will move through the Great Lakes and Northeast with showers and thunderstorms, with severe thunderstorms most likely in the Lower Great Lakes. Near to slightly below normal temperatures will continue across Alaska with mainly dry conditions, while another day of breezy to strong trade winds is expected in Hawai'i.
