HWY 82, Georgia Forestry Commission. CIMT (SA Team 1). Started on private land one mile east of Atkinson, GA. Southern rough, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Pineland Rd, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land 13 miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with backing, smoldering and single tree torching. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area and road closures in effect.

Gun Range, National Forests in Florida, USFS. CIMT (SA Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Sand Drain incident. One mile southwest of Water Town, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Sand Drain, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Eighteen miles northeast of Olustee, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

HWY 41, Everglades National Park, NPS. Six miles west of Miami, FL. Southern rough, timber and grass. Minimal fire behavior. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area and trail closures in effect.

139, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and creeping.

Railroad, Florida Forest Service. Ten miles north of Palatka, FL. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and backing. Numerous structures and railroad infrastructure threatened.

Sargent, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Cow Creek, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land 11 miles south of Bronson, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and creeping. Structures threatened. Trail closures in effect.

SR 26, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land six miles east of Gainesville, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened.

N Main St 2, Florida Forest Service. Thirty-six miles north of Ocala, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Rosindale Road, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. No new information.

Shady Grove, Alabama Forestry Commission. Thirteen miles west of Hatchechubbee, AL. Brush. No new information.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Warm and dry conditions will continue west of the Rockies, with two main areas of focus weather wise throughout the day. Heavy rainfall and thunderstorms will begin across eastern New Mexico, Texas and Louisiana in the morning along the stalled cold front, with scattered thunderstorms developing for a few hours in the afternoon across the San Juans of Colorado and western New Mexico. The front will begin to make progress eastward throughout the day, bringing increased cloud cover, gusty winds, and heavy rain to the southern Gulf states. Conditions remain hot, dry and breezy across central and parts of southern Florida to the south of this cold front. Meanwhile, the Mid Atlantic and Northeast will receive rain and thunderstorms throughout the day as a weaker weather system moves through, bringing some additional light rain behind the front with below normal temperatures. High pressure over the Pacific Northwest shifts slightly eastward into the Northern Rockies, with a weather system approaching the West Coast late in the day developing some isolated showers and thunderstorms across the Cascades. Below normal temperatures and an active pattern continue across Alaska. A moist trade wind pattern is expected across Hawai'i with scattered to numerous windward showers and isolated leeward showers.
