HWY 82, Georgia Forestry Commission. CIMT (SA Team 1). Started on private land one mile east of Atkinson, GA. Southern rough, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations and road closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Pineland Rd, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land 13 miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with backing, flanking and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Gun Range, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (SA Team 3) back to the local unit will occur today. CIMT is also managing the Sand Drain incident. One mile southwest of Water Town, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior.

Sand Drain, National Forests in Florida, USFS. Eighteen miles northeast of Olustee, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Railroad, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land 10 miles north of Palatka, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and backing. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Sargent, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Cow Creek, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land 11 miles south of Bronson, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and creeping. Structures threatened. Trail closures in effect.

SR 26, Florida Forest Service. Six miles east of Gainesville, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Structures threatened. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

N Main St 2, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land 36 miles north of Ocala, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

* **Cement Plant Rd**, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land three miles northwest of North Brooksville, FL. Grass. Moderate fire behavior with flanking and backing. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

139, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile north of Wilma, FL. Southern rough. No new information.

Rosindale Road, North Carolina Forest Service. Eight miles north of Lake Waccamaw, NC. Southern rough. No new information.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Breezy westerly winds 15-25 mph with gusts to 35 mph will develop across the Southwest today, but relative humidity will be higher at 15-30% west of the Divide where isolated showers and thunderstorms will develop. Farther east, relative humidity will fall to 10-18% across eastern New Mexico into the Texas Panhandle creating elevated conditions. An upper-level low will move into California today with showers and thunderstorms, most numerous in the Sierra, with scattered showers and thunderstorms east into the Great Basin and central Rockies. Very warm temperatures will continue across the Northwest and northern Rockies and minimum relative humidity below 25% but winds will be light. A cold front will move through the Mid-Mississippi Valley and Great Lakes with showers and thunderstorms. Ahead of the front, breezy southwest winds will develop across the Piedmont with relative humidity as low as 25% but recent precipitation will mitigate. A storm will move through southwest and south-central Alaska today with widespread showers, but the Interior will remain dry with temperatures near normal. Moderate trade winds are expected across Hawai'i with isolated windward showers.
